2020 Flu Clinic at Albany VA Medical Center

Return The F.A.V.O.R. Discount For Veterans

Return the F.A.V.O.R. (Find & Assist Veterans of Record) is a merchant discount program for eligible Albany County Veterans. The program provides veterans with a discount on services or purchases at participating merchants.

Veterans can enroll by bringing their DD-214 to the Albany County Veterans Service Bureau office Monday through Friday 9am to 4pm. Please call for an appointment to ensure availability and timely service.

VA Guidance on Eligibility of Mental Health Care for Veterans with Other-than-Honorable Discharges

In 2017, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) increased access to mental health care for prior military members who received any form of administrative separation from military service. This eligibility for mental health care extends to certain individuals whose character of discharge prevents them from receiving other VA benefits or healthcare.

- In 2017, Secretary Shulkin formalized these policies using the powers conferred under 38 C.F.R. 17.34 and 38 U.S.C 1702 to provide increased mental health care access to those who served in the U.S military and received an Other-Than-Honorable (OTH) discharge.
- In 2017, the President of the United States signed into law the Honor Our Commitment Act (38 USC 1720I), ensuring that the VA would provide mental health services and behavioral health services for veterans who received a General Under Honorable Conditions or Other-Than-Honorable (OTH) discharge, and who either served in combat, operated drones in combat functions, or were victims of sexual trauma during their military service.
- Former service members with an OTH administrative discharge may receive care for their mental health emergency for an initial period of up to 90 days, which can include inpatient, residential or outpatient care.

Vet Center

These are community-based counseling centers that provide a wide range of social and psychological services to eligible Veterans, active duty service members, National Guard and Reserve, and their families. Readjustment counseling is offered to make a successful transition from military to civilian life or after a traumatic event experienced in the military. Individual, group, marriage and family counseling is offered in addition to referral and connection to other VA or community benefits and services. Vet Center counselors and staff, many of whom are Veterans, are experienced and prepared to discuss the tragedies of war, loss, grief and transition after trauma.

Important Documents & Information When Applying for Benefits

- Honorable Discharge from the Armed Forces or Report of Military Separation (DD-214)
- Record of Marriage
- Birth certificate or adoption papers for dependent children
- Death Certificate of Veteran & any previous spouse
- Divorce Papers
- Veterans social security number
- Department of Veterans Affairs claim or file number
- Annual family income information (wages, retirement, interest, etc.)

All Documents listed above may be copied, except for the DD-214, which must be a certified copy.

UPDATES TO OUR VISITOR POLICY

The Albany VA Medical Center prioritizes the safety of our Veterans and staff. To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, visitation has been limited. Our current visitation policy is focused on balancing the needs & wellbeing of our Veterans.

The following instances permits one (1) visitor (family member, caretaker or responsible adult escort over the age of 18) ONLY at a time:

- Compassionate Care Hospitalized Veterans receiving End of Life Care whose death is expected in the near future
- Hospitalized Veterans with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities, & Veterans with cognitive impairments including dementia
- Essential & Critical to the Care of the Veteran (visitation for this
 purpose must be essential to the care of the Veteran) including:

Accompanying a Veteran to an appointment when he/she is unable to transport themselves or on discharge that requires teaching of a skill the Veteran is unable to perform (e.g., wound care, etc.) or during the intake process and/or discharge process of a Veteran having same day procedure involving sedation.

Upon entering the facility, all visitors will be screened for signs & symptoms of COVID-19 including temperature taken as part of screening process. If you screen positive for signs & symptoms, travel, and/or exposure to COVID-19 person(s), visitation is not permitted.

Spay and Neuter

MHHS will provide spay and neuter surgeries at no cost for cats, dogs an rabbits of veterans who qualify based on their income.

Free Core Vaccinations and Microchip Identification

- For dogs: canine distemper, Bordetella and rabies
- · For cats: feline distemper and rables
- One microchip identifier per pet will be provided at no charge

Spay/neuter and wellness service recipients must income qualify Services are limited based on funding available.

Fee-Waived Pet Adoption

Adoption fees will be waived for veterans who are able to properly care for a pet, with or without support. VA staff referral is required and adopters will follow the standard Humane Society adoption process.

Pet Food Pantry

Via the Furry Friends Food Pantry, veterans can obtain pet food at no charge.

Yona with Cats

Yoga with cats classes combine fitness and fun with adoptable pets. Veterans may attend four complimentary sessions. Classes are held monthly.


