The Department of Social Services respectfully requests legislative approval for the following:

Via Resolution 337 Adopted 10/11/22 authorization was approved to accept a grant from the USDA 2021 SNAP Process and Technology Improvement Grant. Pursuant to the submission package associated with the aforementioned RLA request Albany County Department of Social Services (DSS) is requesting permission to contract with Ventek, Inc. to provide workflow management and status tracking software for our Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Centralized Call Center.

#### **Justification**: (state briefly why legislative action is requested)

Via Resolution 337 Adopted 10/11/22 authorization was approved to accept a grant from the USDA 2021 SNAP Process and Technology Improvement Grant (PTIG). Pursuant to the submission package associated with the previous RLA request Albany County Department of Social Services (DSS) is requesting permission to contract with Ventek, Inc. to provide workflow management and status tracking software for our SNAP Centralized Call Center. No additional funding is requested as the original grant funding includes the Ventek contract amount of \$170,000.

Albany County receives approximately 25,000 SNAP calls annually. Our staffing levels are such that we are not able to address the high volume of calls we receive each day. This delay in returning calls or inability to return a call at all further increases the number of duplicate calls and creates unnecessary traffic in our Reception Area. The volume of calls and in-person visits to have questions answered and conduct interviews, takes staff away from processing applications in a timely and efficient manner.

In addition to the challenges with call volume, Albany County Department of Social Service's SNAP Division operates a manual "task-based" workflow process for over 18,000 cases and 16,000 new applications annually, whereby work is distributed in batches by task to various staff and completion/status is tracked through individual work logs. This manual "task-based" process is arduous when tracking down a case to answer the questions of SNAP clients via telephone.

In order to improve our overall workflow, increase our ability to respond to calls, and better meet the needs of the individuals we serve, we have determined that establishing a SNAP Centralized Call Center with the implementation of technology and software would help us achieve this important goal.

The workflow management and tracking tools include:

• General Client Inquiry (GCI) software provides an easy search function tool to look up NYS Welfare Management System case information including transactions, payments, and budgets. The software has a comments section for Call Center and other SNAP staff to add comments on a case as well as activities section which all provide information on whether a case is pending, has been completed, etc. and which staff the case has been assigned to. Workers will also have the ability to

upload electronic documents directly into the mandated NYS Imaging Enterprise Document Repository (IEDR) without having to print out and scan.

• Status Tracking software is a work management application that provides Supervisors with a tool to assign case tasks to individual workers and tracks what work has been completed and what remains to be done. This software allows for the addition of case review dates and prioritization of tasks and provides an easy mechanism for Supervisory review and sign off on cases. Workers are also able to generate Document Requirement forms for clients directly from Status Tracking. This software will enable supervisory staff to see in real time what is being processed and what needs to be done. The Status Tracking software also has links to GCI and IEDR. Supervisors will also be able to use this software as a monitoring tool for overall SNAP case activity, inbound/outbound client contacts, and case activity by individual staff person or as a Division as a whole.

Both of these software applications have various reporting features so Supervisors can run reports, analyze data for trends, address any workload issues or workflow issues, and identify staff training needs. Both GCI and Status Tracking software applications are being utilized by a number local Department of Social Services (Onondaga, Erie, Dutchess, Fulton, Schenectady, etc.) across NYS for their eligibility programs and call centers.

The development of a call center and implementation of a workflow management system will improve our SNAP work processes and provides an enhanced level of customer service to the individuals we serve.

Albany County Department of Social Services (DSS) is requesting permission to accept a USDA 2021 SNAP Process and Technology Improvement Grant and to contract with the US Department of Agriculture for funding for a SNAP Centralized Call Center and

#### Ventek, Inc. workflow management and status tracking software.

Albany County receives approximately 25,000 SNAP calls annually. Our staffing levels are such that we are not able to address the high volume of calls we receive each day. This SNAP Centralized Call Center will also promote efficiencies in making case changes immediately when a call is received and meeting case processing requirements in a timely manner.

Our original grant application requested funding for \$692,357, During the grant application process, USDA offered additional funding in the amount of \$164,900 for grant purposes. We made additions to the grant compliment of staffing and services which fully support the Call Center. Our request was approved.

DSS is requesting to accept an award in the amount \$853,751 from the USDA SNAP Process and Technology Improvement Grant, which will cover staff salaries and fringe for the five additional staff for the first year of the grant, the purchase of a call center phone system, call center data collection software, workflow management, data reporting and status tracking software, and essential training and furniture, needed to establish the call center. The grant period covers 2021-2024. The development of a call center and implementation of a workflow management system will significantly improve our SNAP work processes and provides an enhanced level of customer service to the individuals we serve. We expect less "churn" of clients calling multiple times or visiting the DSS Reception area unnecessarily when most issues can be handled over the phone for SNAP.

The New York State Early Intervention Program (EIP) is part of the national Early Intervention Program for infants and toddlers with disabilities and their families. First created by Congress in 1986 under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), the EIP is administered by the New York State Department of Health through the Bureau of Early Intervention. In New York State, the Early Intervention Program is established in Article 25 of the Public Health Law and has been in effect since July 1, 1993.

Local governments have responsibility for administering the Early Intervention Program (EIP) subject to regulations of the Commissioner of Health. Administrative funds are provided to all municipalities to offset cost incurred in the implementation of the EIP, exclusive of due process costs. This funding is contingent upon a municipality's compliance with the work plan developed by the Department.

To be eligible for services, children must be less than 3 years of age and have a confirmed disability or established developmental delay, as defined by the State, in one or more of the following areas of development: physical, cognitive, communication, social-emotional, and/or adaptive.

As such, rather than viewed as victims, these children and youth were seen as offenders of the law and treated as such. With the passage of the Act, these children and youth are now viewed as victims, which enable them to receive services to provide for their safety and well-being, in addition to counseling and other specific services to help address their emotional needs.

With the funding to date, DCYF has facilitated trainings and educational outreach to increase community awareness and knowledge on this subject matter.

The Domestic Violence Advocate will provide services through the OCFS Mobile Response project, which was created in response to the Family First Prevention Services Act. It is intended to develop and operate coordinated programs of community-based family support and family preservation services, in order to provide goods and resources for families in need and at risk of contact with the child welfare system.

The Mobile Response van is staffed with a licensed clinician, a behavioral health specialist, a family and/or peer advocate, a service navigation specialist, or a domestic violence advocate. Services are available during both business hours and after hours. Services are available to be responsive to immediate needs such as at the time a placement occurs. Services will be available for ongoing needs for families identified as high risk and in receipt of preventive services. The mobile response van must respond to a request for assistance by going to the home where the child is residing or at a location in the community at a mutually agreed upon time. The mobile response unit must be able to be responsive when families call for help when a child is involved in an emotional or behavioral health need that could lead to a disruption in the home.

Mobile response units work with the parent or caregiver and child to reduce or de-escalate identified behaviors and may provide intervention services to address any immediate concerns identified as well as ongoing needs.

#### Dear Commissioners:

As you are aware, the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) has identified mobile response units as a strategy to develop and operate coordinated programs of community-based family support services and family preservation services. Mobile response services can provide in-home or in-community intervention to prevent child maltreatment among families at risk, assure children's safety within the home, and preserve integrity of the family unit in which children have been maltreated, when the family's needs can be safely addressed effectively in the home.

The mobile response is a demonstration project to evaluate the improved outcomes for children and families when intensive coordinated supports are provided in a targeted manner. At a minimum, the mobile response vans must be staffed with a licensed clinician, a behavioral health specialist, a family and/or peer advocate, a service navigation specialist, or a domestic violence (DV) advocate. OCFS is providing this current round of funding to support the DV advocate (see *Attachment A, Domestic Violence Advocate Allocations*). A DV advocate is any person who is acting under the direction and supervision of a licensed and approved domestic violence program and has satisfied the training standards required by OCFS.<sup>1</sup>

Domestic violence remains one of the primary reasons a family interfaces with the child welfare system. OCFS' goal is to provide immediate and relevant mobile response support to parents and caregivers, which will empower them to assist their child(ren) at home and mitigate disruptions, thus supporting the healing process.

It is important that DV advocates be incorporated seamlessly into the continuum of services as part of your mobile response services pilot. As a member of the mobile response team, the DV advocate will work with the parent or caregiver and child, when DV factors are present, to reduce or de-escalate identified behaviors and may provide intervention services to address any immediate concerns as well as ongoing needs. As a member of the mobile response team, the mobile response DV advocate will focus on the core services<sup>2</sup> of

- counseling,
- safety planning,
- · community education/outreach activities,
- advocacy,
- language access,
- · information and referral services, and
- support groups.

Services will be available during and after business hours and will be responsive to immediate needs. Services will also be available for ongoing needs for families, including domestic violence survivors.

It is essential that DV advocates participate in any required training and credentialling, and receive ongoing supervision and professional development to support their efficacy as response team members.

Funding provided must be utilized for the hiring of a full-time DV advocate. Funds can also be used for the cost of related salaries, fringe benefits, and travel expenditures.

#### **Claiming Requirements**

Claims for these funds must be submitted as described below. These funds are to be used only to reimburse expenditures beginning September 1, 2022, and ending August 31, 2023, and final accepted in the Automated Claiming System (ACS) by November 31, 2023.

Expenditures for the mobile response DV advocate project should be claimed through the RF17 claim package for special project claiming. These costs are first identified on the RF2A claim package as F17 functional costs and reported in the F17 column on the LDSS-923 Cost Allocation Schedule of Payments Administrative Expenses Other Than Salaries and the LDSS-2347, Schedule D, DSS Administrative Expenses Allocation and Distribution by Function and Program. After final accepting the RF2A claim package, the individual project costs are then reported under the project label "Mobile Response DV Advocate" on the LDSS-4975A, RF17 Worksheet, Distribution of Allocated Costs to Other Reimbursable Programs.

Salaries, fringe benefits, staff counts, and central services costs are directly entered on the LDSS-4975A RF17 Worksheet, *Distribution of Allocated Costs to Other Reimbursable Programs*, while overhead costs are automatically brought over from the RF2A, Schedule D, and distributed based upon the proportion of number of staff assigned to this project. Employees not working all their time on the mobile response DV advocate project must maintain time studies to support the salary and fringe benefit costs allocated to the program.

Non-salary administrative costs are reported with the appropriate object of expense codes on the LDSS-923B, Summary-Administrative (page 1), Schedule of Payments for Expenses Other Than Salaries for Other Reimbursable Programs. Program costs should be reported as object of expense 37-Special Project Program Expense on the LDSS-923B, Summary-Program (page 2), Schedule of Payments for Expenses Other Than Salaries for Other Reimbursable Programs.

Total project costs should be reported on the LDSS-4975, *Monthly Statement of Special Project Claims Federal and State Aid (RF17)*, as 100% federal share. For each local department of social services (LDSS), the expenditures reported for *Family Peer Support Services* will be reimbursed up to the amount of the district's allocation. Further instructions for completing the time studies, the LDSS-923 and Schedule D, and RF17 claim package are found in Chapters 4, 7, and 18,

The Department respectfully requests Legislative authorization to receive funding from NYS OCFS and to sign and submit a Supervision and Treatment Services for Juvenile Program Plan (STSJP) to NYS OCFS. The total funding allocation is \$172,722 for the term of October 1, 2022 – September 30, 2023.

NYS Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) provides funding to support local programming to divert youth safely from unnecessary detention and/or placement admissions. It is a key element of New York's juvenile justice reform efforts. STSJP funding is allocated to each locality by NYS OCFS.

Albany County is receiving a funding allocation of \$172,722, which will continue to support programming at Albany County Probation Department and Albany County Family Court for juvenile justice involved youth. The goal of this programming is to prevent out of home placement of youth, maintain them safely in their community, and when placement is needed, to safely expedite the reintegration of such youth back into the community. All counties are required to sign and submit a STSJP plan to include such funded programming.

Albany County is well positioned to successfully provide such programming and meet the goals of the STSJP funding, as we are participating in a number of other juvenile justice system reform initiatives including the Regional Youth Justice Team.

NYS has implemented the Regional Youth Justice Teams throughout the state; the goal of which is to improve juvenile justice policies, practices and programming. Albany County is one of nine counties participating in the Capital Region Youth Justice Team. Albany County is able to share the strategies being implemented locally through STSJP funding with the other participating counties in the Regional Team as well as statewide.

Thank you for submitting Albany County's Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) plan for Program Year (PY) 2022-2023. Your plan has been reviewed by the Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS), and we are pleased to inform you that your STSJP plan has been <u>approved</u>.

Please note that this approval does not extend to the amount listed for the STSJP-RTA programming. Upon NYS DOB approval, OCFS will send out a revised STSJP approval letter reflecting the STSJP-RTA programming amount approved by NYS DOB for 2022-2023 as applicable.

Albany County is eligible to receive 62% State reimbursement for STSJP expenditures up to the capped STSJP allocation amount. Your municipality will continue to receive 49% State reimbursement for eligible non-Raise The age detention services expenditures up to the capped allocation amount. If your municipality shifts a portion of its detention allocation into its STSJP plan, your municipality will receive 62% State reimbursement, up to the capped allocation, if such shifted funds are spent on STSJP eligible expenditures. A municipality may make a detention allocation shift at the time of the STSJP plan submission or up until June 30, 2023, unless otherwise approved by the Office of Children and Family Services.

If the County plans to shift its detention allocation for STSJP eligible expenses, please submit a request on official letterhead to Lynn Tubbs and email it to <a href="mailto:stsip@ocfs.ny.gov">stsip@ocfs.ny.gov</a> outlining

- 1. the amount that will be shifted and
- 2. the type of programming or services the re-purposed detention funds will be used for under STSJP

Once the shift is approved, an amended STSJP plan will need to be submitted.

As a reminder, to access RTA reimbursement for which a municipality may be eligible, the expenditures must be specifically included in a locality's comprehensive RTA plan and approved by the NYS Division of Budget.

All STSJP claims must be submitted electronically via the Juvenile Detention Automated System (JDAS) for the service period of October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023.
