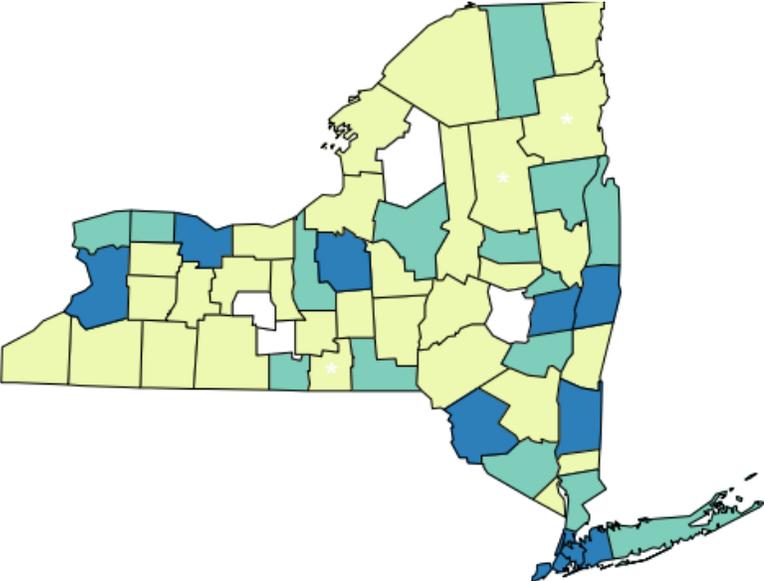

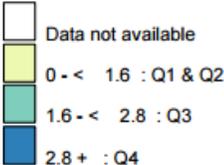

Assault Hospitalizations per 10,000 population



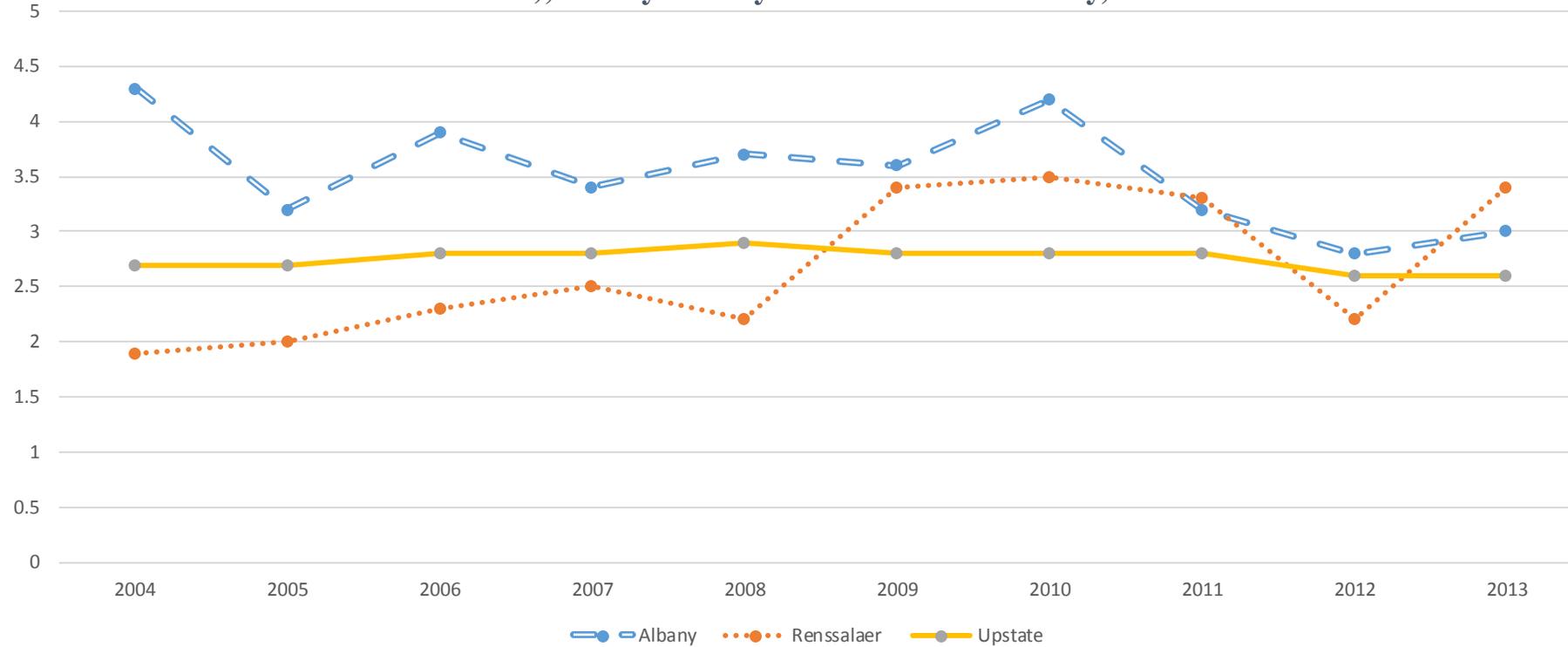
Hospital Discharge Rate

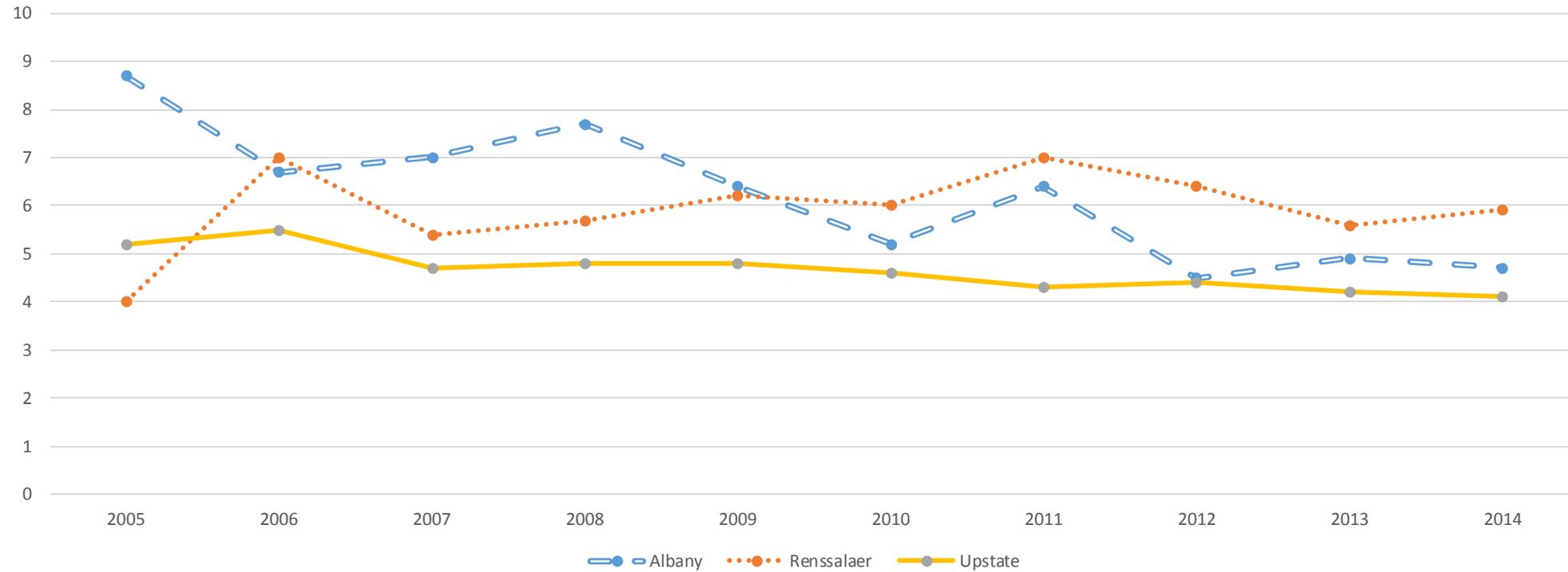


Age-Adjusted Assault Hospitalization Rate per 10,000 population for New York State (excl. NYC), Albany County and Renssalaer County, 2005-2013

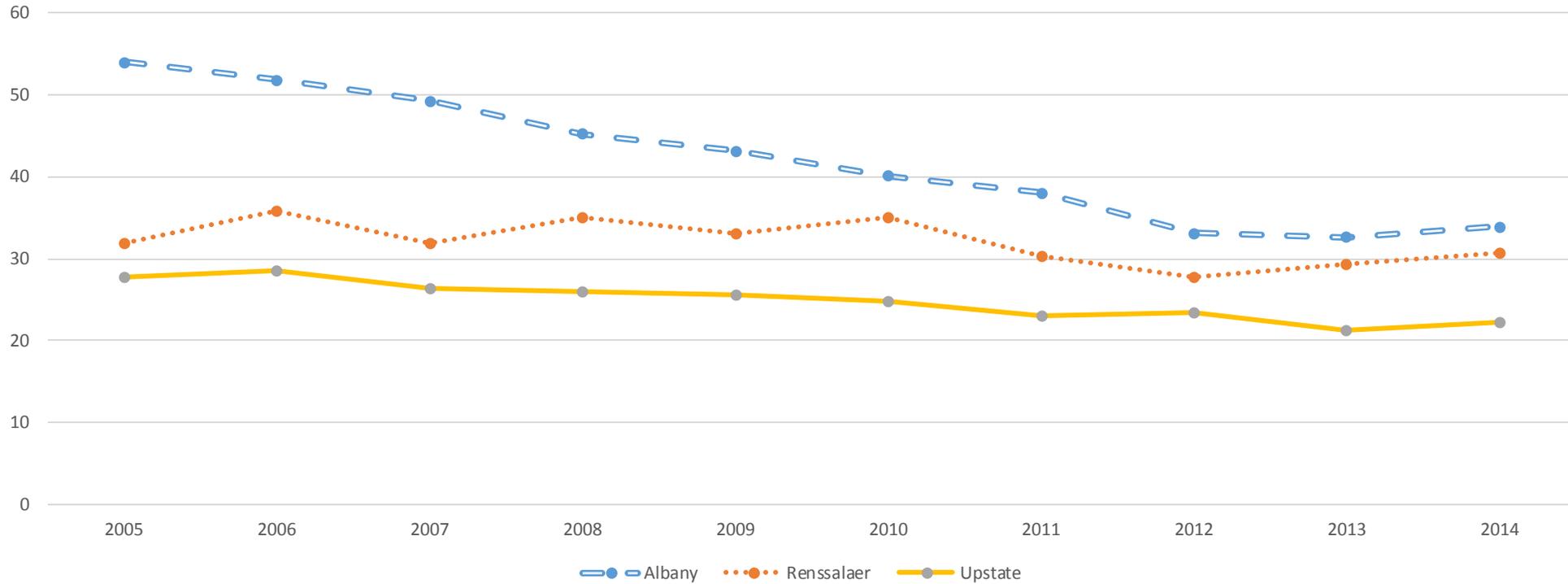

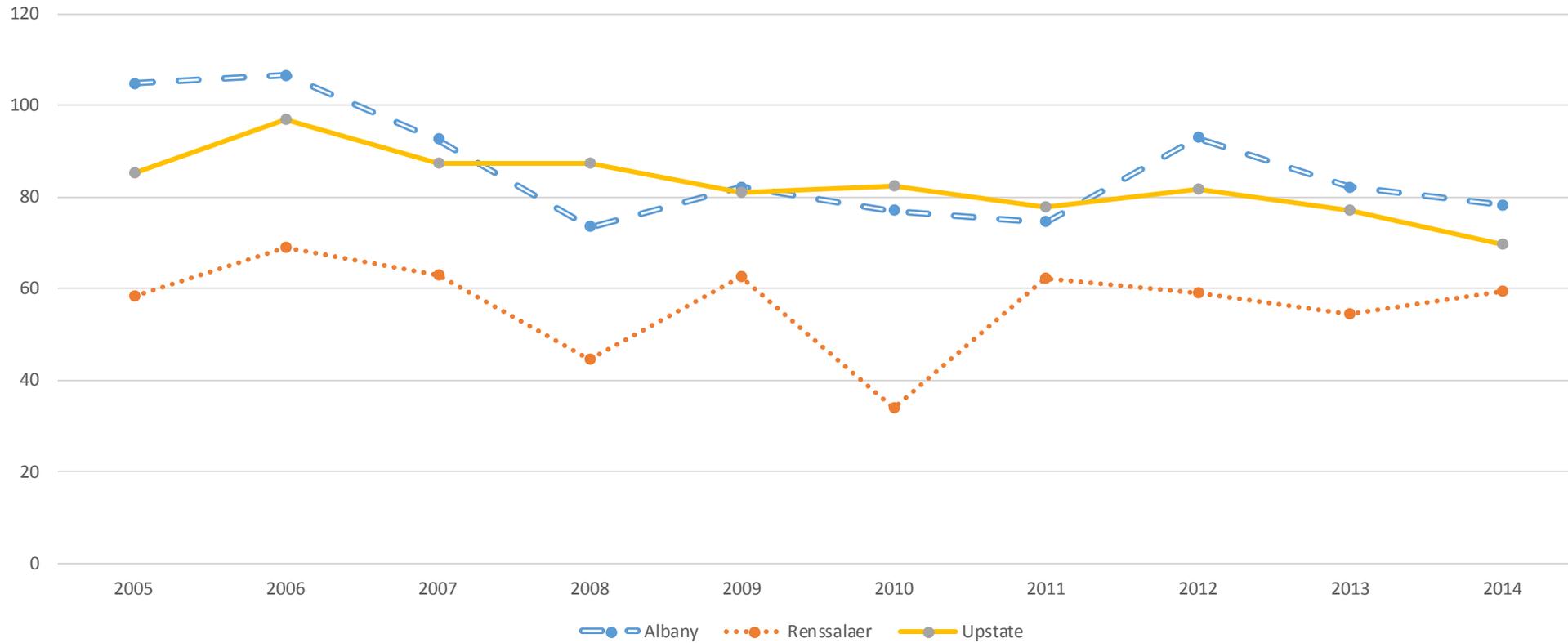


Violent Crime Rate per 10,000 population for New York State (excl. NYC), Albany County and Renssalaer County, 2005-2014

Crime Summary



Annually, Albany and Renssalaer counties have:

- **1,367 Assault ED Visits**
- **143 Assault Hospitalizations**
- **240 Firearm-related Crimes**
- **1,538 Violent Crimes**
- **11,957 Property Crimes**
- **369 Young Adult Arrests for Drug Possession/Sale/Use**

Crime Summary

- **Both Albany and Renssalaer counties had higher rates of assault hospitalizations than ROS and fall into the 4th risk quartile; Albany county had higher rates of assault ED visits than ROS.**
- **Both Albany and Renssalaer counties were higher than ROS for firearm-related crimes, violent crime and property crimes.**
- **Young Adult arrests for drug possession/sale/use higher for Albany county in comparison to ROS, but were lower for Renssalaer county in comparison to ROS.**
- **For Assaults, Renssalaer county had a general increase since 2007, Albany showed a decreasing trend since 2010.**
- **Firearm-related crimes, Violent Crimes and Young Adult arrests for drug possession/sale/use have been on a decreasing trend for both counties in comparison to ROS.**
- **The Black non-Hispanic population was 7 times more likely to have an assault resulting in hospitalization in Renssalaer and 9 times more likely in Albany county, compared to the White non-Hispanic population.**
- **Residents in low income ZIPs were about 3 times more likely to have an assault resulting in hospitalization in Renssalaer county and 6 times more likely in Albany, compared to residents of higher income ZIPs.**

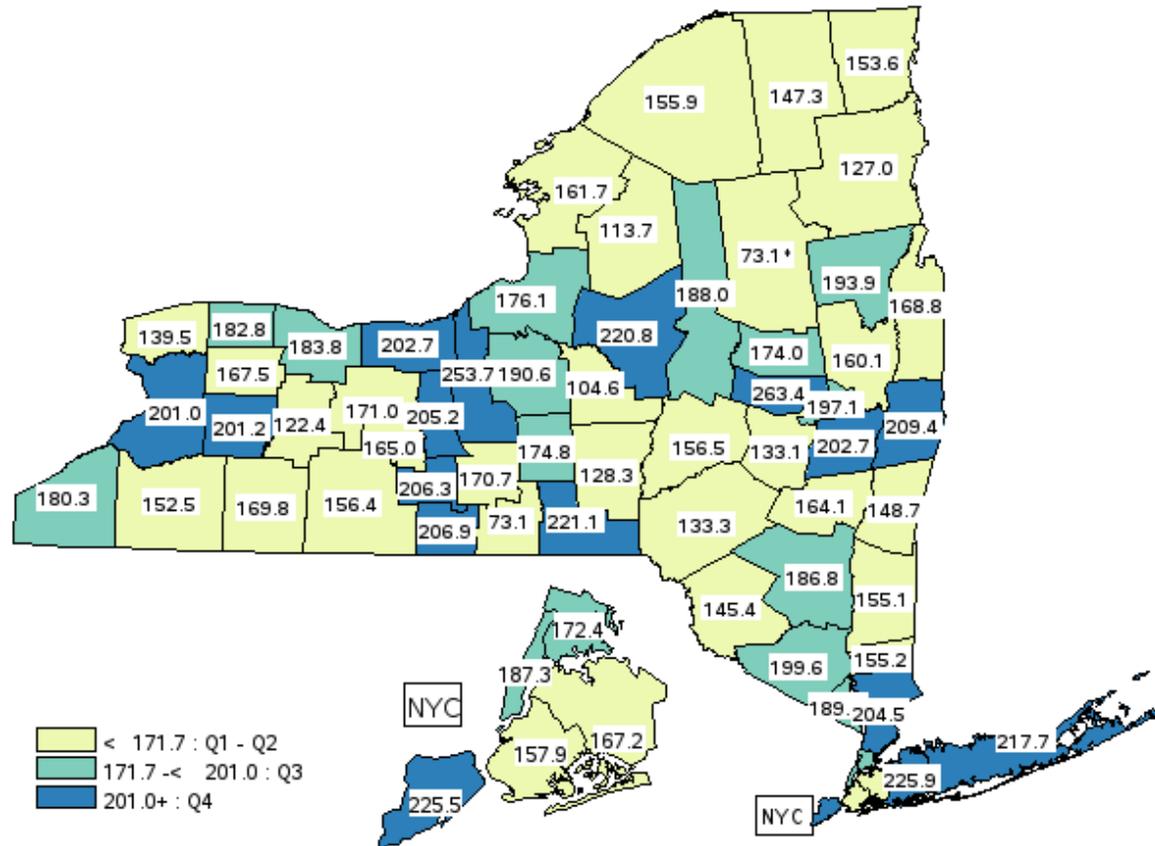

Fall Hospitalizations, ages 65+ per 10,000

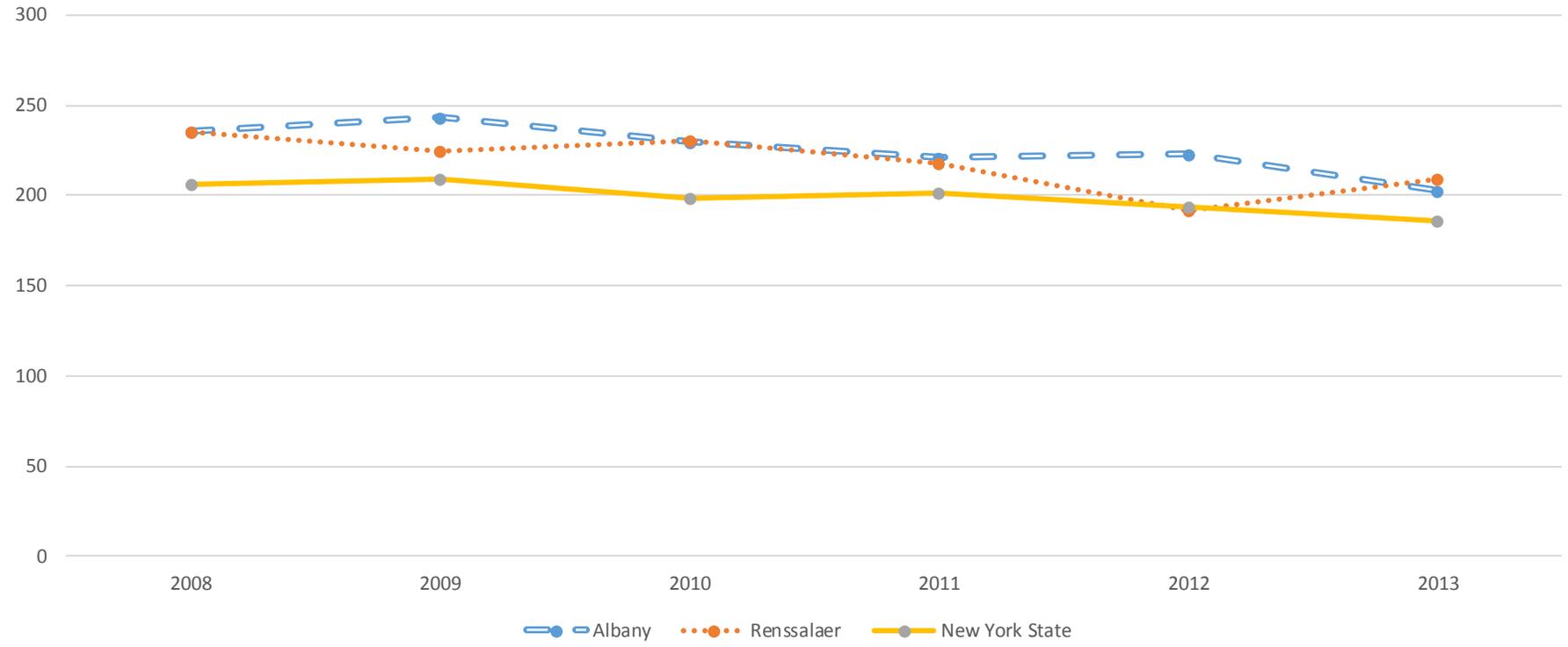

Falls Summary



Annually, Albany and Renssalaer counties have:

- **2,266 ED visits due to falls in the 65+ years population.**
- **1,424 Hospitalizations due to falls in the 65+ years population.**
- **979 ED visits due to falls in the 1-4 years population.**
- **13 Hospitalizations due to falls in the 1-4 years population.**

Falls in the Elderly Summary

- **Albany county and Renssalaer counties had lower rates for ED visits due to falls in the 65+ year population in comparison to ROS; Both Albany and Renssalaer counties had higher rates for hospitalizations due to falls in the 65+ year population than ROS and fall into the 4th risk quartile.**
- **Hospitalizations due to falls increased with age in the elderly population, with those 85+ being more likely to be hospitalized due to a fall.**
- **Fall hospitalizations in the 65+ population have been decreasing since 2008.**
- **The male population had 1.3- 1.5 times the rate of fall ED visits and hospitalization rates compared to their female counterparts.**
- **The White non-Hispanic population had 1.4 times the fall hospitalization rate in the 65+ population in Renssalaer county, and 1.9 times that in Albany county, when compared to the Black non-Hispanic population.**
- **High risk neighborhoods had 1.3- 3.1 times the rate of ED visits due to falls in the 65+ year population in Albany when compared to ROS. High risk neighborhoods in Renssalaer county had 1.1-1.7 times the rate if ED visits due to falls in the same population when compared to ROS.**
- **High risk neighborhoods had 1.4- 2.0 times the rate of hospitalizations due to falls in the 65+ population in Albany county when compared to ROS. High risk neighborhoods in Renssalaer county had 1.2-1.9 times the rate of hospitalizations due to falls in the 65+ population when compared to ROS.**
