Backup Material for Contract Authorization with Parsons Child and Family Center for the Participants Achieving Through Hard-work (PATH) Program, pertaining to the Supervision and Treatment Services for Juvenile Program (STSJP)

The Department respectfully requests Legislative authorization to contract with Parsons Child and Family Center for the Participants Achieving Through Hardwork (PATH) Program. The contract terms are for the period of January 1, 2023 through September 30, 2023 in the amount of \$261,324.

The PATH program has been approved by the NYS Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) as part of Albany County's Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) plan for Program Year (PY) 2022-2023. The proposed contract includes two program components; \$100,000 for STSJP with 68% reimbursement and \$161,324 for STSJP Raise the Age (RTA) with 100% reimbursement to the county.

The PATH program was designed to provide enhanced case management services to the RTA population, while incorporating the use of community coaches/credible messengers/mentors. The goal of this program ultimately is to respond to each youth's individual needs, while maintaining them safely in the community, thereby reducing the need for Family Court Intervention for Intake/Diversion cases and for those youth already involved in Family Court, reducing the use of detention and out of home placement

NYS Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) provides funding to support local programming to divert youth safely from unnecessary detention and/or placement admissions. It is a key element of New York's juvenile justice reform efforts. STSJP funding is allocated to each locality by NYS OCFS to support programming for juvenile justice involved youth. The goal of this programming is to prevent out of home placement of youth, maintain them safely in their community, and when placement is needed, to safely expedite the reintegration of such youth back into the community.

The PATH program was originally designed and is currently funded under RTA to provide enhanced case management services to the RTA population, while incorporating the use of community coaches/credible messengers/mentors. Parsons Child and Family Center will administer this program and will collaborate with other community agencies to identify credible messengers/mentors who are members of the community in which they serve with real life experiences and will help in assisting youth and families navigate the juvenile justice system, all of which will be under the direct supervision and guidance of a case manager. STSJP funding for this program will be used to expand the use of this program for PINS youth both as an early intervention and an alternative to pre-dispositional placement. Additionally, this service will be available to children eligible under the differential response to prevent their entry into the juvenile justice or child welfare systems in the future. In addition, under RTA, two Probation Officers will be assigned to work directly with this program and will provide

Dear Chief Executive Officer,

Thank you for submitting Albany County's Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) plan for Program Year (PY) 2022-2023. Your entire STSJP plan, including any amounts listed for PY 2022-2023 STSJP-RTA, has been **approved**.

The County is eligible to receive 62% State reimbursement for STSJP expenditures up to the capped STSJP allocation amount. Your municipality will continue to receive 49% State reimbursement for eligible detention services expenditures up to the capped allocation amount. If your municipality shifts a portion of its detention allocation into its STSJP plan, your municipality will receive 62% State reimbursement, up to the capped allocation, if such shifted funds are spent on STSJP eligible expenditures. A municipality may make a detention allocation shift at the time of the STSJP plan submission or up until June 30, 2023, unless otherwise approved by the Office of Children and Family Services.

If the County plans to shift its detention allocation for STSJP eligible expenses, please submit a request on official letterhead to Lynn Tubbs and email it to stsip@ocfs.ny.gov outlining

- 1. the amount that will be shifted and
- 2. the type of programming or services the re-purposed detention funds will be used for under STSJP

Once the shift is approved, an amended STSJP plan will need to be submitted.

As a reminder, to access RTA reimbursement that a municipality may be eligible for, the expenditures must be specifically included in a locality's comprehensive RTA plan.

All STSJP claims, inclusive of STSJP-RTA, must be submitted electronically via the Juvenile Detention Automated System (JDAS) for the service period of October 1, 2022 to September 30, 2023. WHEREAS, The Commissioner of the Albany County Department for Children, Youth and Families has requested authorization to renew an agreement with the Albany County Probation Department regarding prevention, supervision and treatment services for juveniles for the term commencing January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 in an amount not to exceed \$1,116,459, and

WHEREAS, The funding will be used to offset the salary and fringe benefit costs for Probation Department employees as well as services for programs in the Juvenile Community Accountability Board, PINS 18, the Parent Project, Juvenile Release Under Supervision and Raise the Age programs all of which are designed to reduce the likelihood of the youth's further penetration into the Juvenile Justice system, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, By the Albany County Legislature that the County Executive is authorized to execute an interdepartmental agreement between the Department for Children, Youth and Families and the Probation Department regarding prevention, supervision and treatment services for juveniles for the term commencing January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022 in an amount not to exceed \$1,116,459, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Attorney is authorized to approve said agreement as to form and content, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the County Legislature is directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to the appropriate County Officials.
