

## **Court Advocate**

**Description:** Court Advocates provide victims of crime with emotional support, court advocacy, information, referrals, and assistance in completing compensation forms with the New York State Office of Victim Services (OVS).

**Hours and Location:** Court Advocates are placed in the various courts around Albany County according to their availability.

## **Key Responsibilities:**

- Speak to victims of crime when they attend their offenders' arraignment
- Provide emotional support, information and referrals
- Answer questions about the criminal justice system
- Assist victims in filing compensation forms
- Complete a total of 50 hours of online training to become a certified Crime Victim Advocate
- Maintain confidentiality at all times

**Training:** Court Advocates complete the Center's initial 15-hour online training module pertaining to the workings of the criminal justice system and the emotional issues surrounding victimization. This is followed by the 35-hour web-based *Office for Victims of Crime, Victim Assistance Training (OVC-VAT-Online)* and the opportunity to shadow staff Caseworkers.

**Time Commitment:** Court Advocates are required to commit to a minimum of six months of volunteering following their initial 15-hour training.

**Support/Supervision:** All Court Advocates are supervised by the Supervising Crime Victim Caseworker and provided with ongoing supervision and support as needed.

**Qualifications:** The Center welcomes all persons 19 years and older as Court Advocates. Volunteers must be comfortable speaking to victims in a courtroom setting and be able to communicate the victim's needs to court personnel.
