

RESOLUTION NO. 91

AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH PROJECT STRIVE REGARDING CASE PLANNING PREVENTION SERVICES

By Social Services Committee, Mr. Clenahan, Ms. McKnight and Mr. Scavo:

WHEREAS, The Commissioner of the Department for Children, Youth and Families, after an RFP process, has requested authorization to enter into an agreement with Project Strive regarding prevention services for case planning and afterschool programs for the period commencing April 1, 2010 and ending March 31, 2011 in the amount of \$928,200, and

WHEREAS, Project Strive services youth and their families who demonstrate a variety of significant behavioral and emotional problems, and

WHEREAS, Project Strive's case planning is designed to prevent children and youth from entering foster care and to provide services for youth discharged from foster care and their families including reunification when appropriate, and

WHEREAS, The agreement will provide comprehensive assessment services, individual counseling, case planning, psychological consultation, crisis intervention services, clinical support and Family Court related assessments, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, By the Albany County Legislature that the County Executive is authorized to enter into an agreement with Project Strive regarding prevention services for case planning and afterschool programs for the period commencing April 1, 2010 and ending March 31, 2011 in an amount not to exceed \$928,200, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the County Attorney is authorized to approve said agreement as to form and content, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the County Legislature is directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to the appropriate County Officials.
