DETERMINATION THAT THE PROPOSED REHABILITATION OF CR102 (OLD QUARRY ROAD/STARR ROAD) IN THE TOWNS OF NEW SCOTLAND, BETHLEHEM AND COEYMANS WILL NOT HAVE A SIGNIFICANT EFFECT ON THE ENVIRONMENT

By Audit and Finance Committee and Mr. Shafer:

WHEREAS, Albany County proposes to improve 8.5 miles of CR102 (Old Quarry Road and Starr Road) from the northern terminus at State Route 32 in the Town of New Scotland through the Town of Bethlehem to the south terminus at State Route 143 in the Town of Coeymans, and

WHEREAS, The proposed rehabilitation project would involve resurfacing the two 10-foot travel lanes, widening the paved surface to include the currently unpaved two-foot shoulders, boxing out shoulders and filling side slopes where necessary, installing box beam guide rails, placing reflectorized pavement striping, improving the existing draining system, repairing the road surface on the deck of the Onesquethaw Creek bridge and in-kind replacement of the existing concrete box culvert at the Feuri Spruyt, and

WHEREAS, The proposed action is subject to the requirements of State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) pursuant to 6 NYCRR 617, and

WHEREAS, Albany County has assumed the designation of Lead Agency for the purpose of compliance with SEQR for this unlisted action, and

WHEREAS, The Albany County Department of Economic Development, Conservation and Planning, acting on behalf of the Albany County Legislature has reviewed the proposed action and has complied with all applicable administrative and procedural requirements on behalf of the County, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Albany County Legislature has considered the findings of the Department of Economic Development, Conservation and Planning and has determined that the proposed action will not have a significant effect on the environment, and, be it further

RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the County Legislature is directed to forward certified copies of this resolution to the appropriate County Officials.
