RESOLVED, By the County Legislature of the County of Albany that a public hearing on proposed Local Law No. "A" for 2024, "A Local Law of the County of Albany, New York Amending Chapter 106 of the Albany County Code, Setting forth Requirements for Facilities within Albany County where the Local Governmental Unit identified by New York State is the Albany County Department of Mental Health" to be held by the Albany County Legislature at 7:15 p.m. on Tuesday, March 26, 2024, with participation information to be made available on the Albany County website, and the Clerk of the County Legislature is directed to cause notice of such hearing to be published containing the necessary information in accordance with the applicable provisions of law.

LOCAL LAW "A" FOR 2024

A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY, NEW YORK AMENDING CHAPTER 106 OF THE ALBANY COUNTY CODE, SETTING FORTH REQUIREMENTS FOR FACILITIES WITHIN ALBANY COUNTY WHERE THE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNIT IDENTIFIED BY NEW YORK STATE IS THE ALBANY COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH

Introduced: 2/12/24 By Mclean Lane:

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article Creation.

Chapter 106, Article II, Local Governmental Unit, is hereby created.

Section 2. § 106-9 -- Legislative Purpose and Intent.

This legislation is to ensure that when an application is received by the Albany County Department of Mental Health where they are identified by New York State as the local governmental unit, before any decisions are made by County or State authorities, Albany County residents are offered the opportunity to be informed.

Section 3. § 106-10 - Notice of Receipt of Application to Involved Representatives.

A. Within 10 days of receipt of an application or notice of application from a New York State Agency where the Albany County Department of Mental Health is identified as the "local governmental unit" the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health shall provide to the following representatives a copy of the application and/or notice of application from OASAS, and allow 30 days for those representatives to submit comment on the proposed facility:

- 1) The Albany County Legislator who represents the legislative district which contains the proposed location or facility; and
- 2) Each City, Town, or Village Mayor or Supervisor who represents the municipality which contains the proposed location or facility; and
- 3) Each City, Town, or Village Council or Board member who represents the municipality which contains the proposed location or facility.
- B. All notifications pursuant to this Section shall be sent via regular mail, with an electronic mail following which shall contain a digital version or electronic link to

the application and/or notice of application along with all accompanying documents and information.

C. No notice is required pursuant to this Local Law when the proposed application is only to re-locate an already existing facility within the same municipality in the County of Albany.

Section 4. § 106-11 - Notice of Public Meeting to Involved Representatives.

- A. Within 5 days of the posting of a notice of a public meeting agenda of the Behavioral Health Services Advisory Council, the Albany County Community Services Board, and/or the Albany County Alcohol and Substance Abuse Subcommittee where an application to locate a facility to treat substance use disorders in the County of Albany is on the agenda, the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health shall provide a copy of that notice to the following representatives:
- 1) The Albany County Legislator who represents the legislative district which contains the proposed location or facility; and
- 2) Each City, Town, or Village Mayor or Supervisor who represents the municipality which contains the proposed location or facility; and
- 3) Each City, Town, or Village Council or Board member who represents the municipality which contains the proposed location or facility.
- B. All notifications pursuant to this Section shall be sent via regular mail, with an electronic mail following which shall contain a digital version or electronic link to the application and/or notice of application along with all accompanying documents and information.
- C. No notice is required pursuant to this Local Law when the proposed application is only to re-locate an already existing facility within the same municipality in the County of Albany.

Section 5. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, firm, corporation or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of the Local Law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of the Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm, corporation or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order may be rendered.

Section 6. SEQRA Compliance.

This County Legislature determines that this local law constitutes a "Type II action" pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and that no further action under SEQRA is required.

Section 7. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately after its filing with the Secretary of State.

ASPR Awards \$50 Million from the American Rescue Plan to Strengthen the Medical Reserve Corps

Funding targets community health and health equity needs in 33 jurisdictions

Today, the Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR (/Pages/Home.aspx)) announced \$50 million in awards to 33 states and jurisdictions (/MRC/Pages/STTRONG.aspx) to strengthen the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) network – focusing on emergency preparedness, response, and health equity needs. Funding for the first-ever MRC State, Territory and Tribal Nations, Representative Organizations for Next Generation (MRC-STTRONG) grant program is from the American Rescue Plan.

"MRC units are a force multiplier for local emergency responses," said Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response Dawn O'Connell. "The ARP-funded awards announced today will bolster response efforts in communities across the nation, building on the invaluable role that the MRC played during our fight against COVID-19."

The MRC is a national network of 300,000 volunteers organized into approximately 750 local community-based groups committed to improving local emergency response capabilities, reducing vulnerabilities, and building community preparedness and resilience.

MRC units organize and utilize local volunteers who donate their time and expertise to prepare for and respond to emergencies and to support steady-state preparedness initiatives. They have supported emergency shelter operations and medical care during extreme weather events, organized vaccine clinics and testing sites during the COVID-19 response, provided medical support during large public gatherings, and much more. MRC volunteers also promote community preparedness to improve everyday health and reduce potential public health risks and vulnerabilities.

ASPR first **announced** (/newsroom/Pages/MRC-Funding-Expands-Network-Mar2023.aspx) the MRC-STTRONG funding availability in March 2023. The competitive grant process allowed ASPR to provide funding for the following awards:

On behalf of Governor Kathy Hochul, I'm pleased to inform you that your county is eligible to participate in the recently announced Round 4 of the State Septic System Replacement Program. The State has prepared a list of eligible waterbodies for your county (PWL worksheet attached). We ask that your county complete the following steps and reply via email to nysepticreplace@dec.ny.gov by January 26, 2024.

- 1. Become familiar with the State Septic System Replacement Fund Grant program. The State Septic System Replacement Fund Grant Program was established in 2017 to improve water quality by replacing failing or inadequate septic systems around a waterbody known to be impaired by discharge from septic systems and where replacing septic systems will improve water quality. To learn about the program and its requirements visit the links listed below. The web pages contain information about eligible projects, a participating county's obligations, etc.

This program is designed to incentivized replacing failing and inadequate septic systems to improve water quality. However, there are situation where replacing a septic system will not improve water quality. For example, if:
 - Lot sizes are too small.
 - Soils do not provide adequate percolation or not conducive to septic systems.
 - Municipality is actively or has plans to sewer area.

Consider these scenarios when determining which waterbodies/WIPWL segments to include in the program.

2. Determine if your County would like to participate in Round 4 of the State Septic System Replacement Program.



3a. If your county would like to participate in the Program, complete your attached PWL Worksheet. Only waterbodies that are provided on the PWL Worksheet are eligible for Round 4 of the program. DO NOT add additional waterbodies or PWL segments to the worksheet.

To complete the PWL Worksheet, fill in:

- Column F (County Estimated Septic Systems within 250 ft)
- Column G (County Wants to Include in Septic Program (Yes/No))
- Column H (Reason for Not Including Waterbody in the Program).

Column E (*NYSDEC Estimated Septic Within 250 ft*) in the PWL Worksheet may indicate that some waterbodies have a zero. This means that DEC's model identified no septic systems within 250 feet of the shoreline. If the County confirms that there are no septic systems then, the waterbody will be removed from the list.

State Septic System Replacement Program

Program Summary

The Clean Water Infrastructure Act of 2017 (L. 2017, c. 57, Part T) established the Septic System Replacement Fund to provide a source of funding for the replacement of cesspools and septic systems in New York State. This grant program (the "Program") seeks to reduce the environmental and public-health impacts associated with the discharge of effluent from cesspools and septic systems on groundwater used as drinking water, as well as threatened or impaired waterbodies.

The state Department of Environmental Conservation ("DEC") and the state Department of Health ("DOH") have determined priority geographic areas where the Program will provide grants for eligible septic system projects. An area's designation as a priority is based on its vulnerability to contamination (e.g. the presence of a sole-source aquifer, or a known water-quality impairment), population density, soils, hydrogeology, climate, and reasonable ability for septic system projects to mitigate water quality impacts. Under the Program, counties in which priority geographic areas are located can access monies from the Fund to provide grants to reimburse property owners for up to 50% of the eligible costs (up to a maximum of \$10,000) of their eligible septic system projects.

The Program provides grants for eligible "septic system projects" involving:

- the replacement of a cesspool with a septic system, or
- the installation, replacement or upgrade of a septic system or septic system components, or installation of enhanced treatment technologies, including an advanced nitrogen removal system.

Overview

DEC and DOH have identified priority geographic areas for the replacement of septic systems, and allocated funding to counties from the Fund. Counties that have priority areas within their boundaries, and choose to participate in this program, are called "Participating Counties."

Participating Counties notify owners of property served by septic systems (including residences and small businesses) that they could be eligible for financial assistance from the Septic System Replacement Program. Once notified, property owners who undertake a septic system project may apply to the Participating County for a grant from the Program.

Participating Counties review and evaluate the applications and determine financial assistance awards based on the Program criteria and consideration of a property's location in relation to a waterbody, impacts to groundwater used as drinking water, and the condition of the property owner's current septic system. Participating Counties may set graduated incentive reimbursement rates for septic system projects to maximize

pollution reduction outcomes. Septic system projects located in a priority geographic area identified by DEC as threatened or impaired by nitrogen must reduce nitrogen levels by at least 30% to receive assistance.

After evaluating applications and making funding decisions, Participating Counties notify the property owners of their grant awards by sending them award letters that include the amount, and other terms and conditions, of the grant. Property owners must formally accept the grant award and its terms and conditions by signing and returning the letter to their participating counties, after which property owners may proceed and hire design professionals and contractors to complete the work on their septic system projects.

As the Program provides funding on a reimbursement basis, property owners are initially responsible for the total cost of their septic system projects. Property owners may also choose to have the reimbursement paid directly to their contractors, which could reduce their out-of-pocket costs.

To receive reimbursement, property owners submit a reimbursement request to the Participating County in which they are located upon completion of their septic system projects. Reimbursement requests must include:

- (i) the completed Reimbursement Request form;
- (ii) any applicable design approval for the septic system project;
- (iii) description of all work completed;
- (iv) cost documentation and invoice or invoices for eligible costs; and
- (v) if applicable, a written authorization for a septic system contractor directly to receive the property owner's reimbursement.

Participating Counties review the reimbursement requests, and approve, adjust or deny them, as appropriate. No more often than once a month, Participating Counties aggregate the reimbursement requests they've received, and certify that amount in a disbursement request to the Environmental Facilities Corporation ("EFC"), which administers the Septic System Replacement Fund. EFC reviews the disbursement requests and once it is confirmed that all necessary documentation has been received and verified, disburses monies from the fund to the participating counties, which then issue reimbursement payments to property owners or their contractors for their completed septic system projects.
