The Chairperson of the County Legislature shall allow each member of the public whose name is reached five (5) minutes, except that the Chairperson, in his/her discretion, may limit speakers to three (3) minutes to give as many speakers as possible an opportunity to address the issues on that evening's legislative agenda. If all speakers wishing to address the legislature on that evening's agenda have spoken, speakers wishing to speak on other matters pertaining to Albany County may address the legislature in the remaining time before the meeting and, if at the end of the hour there are still speakers who have not been heard, the Public Forum shall continue

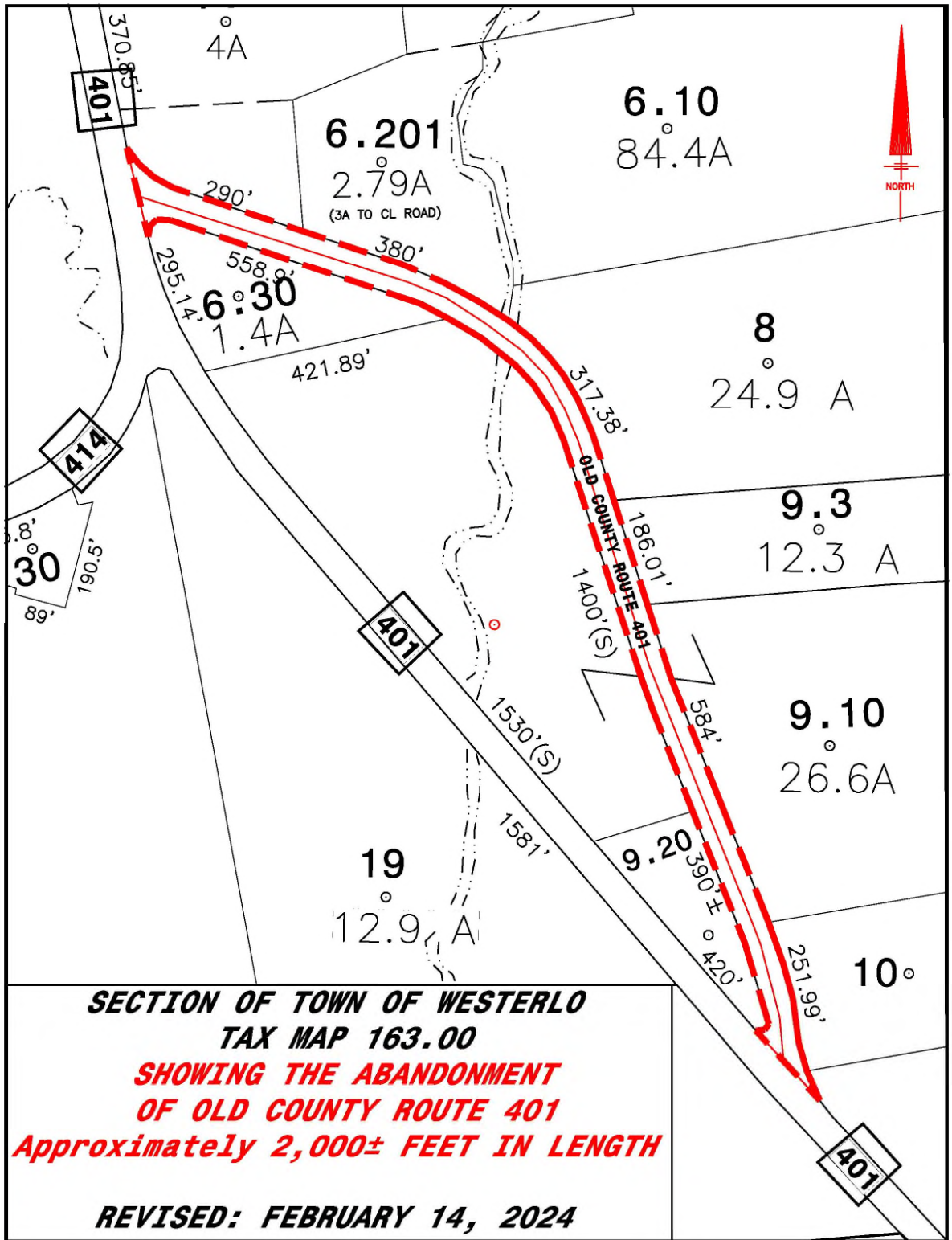

WHEREAS, It is the view of this Honorable Body that fifteen (15) years of service to Albany County is sufficient to vest employees with health insurance benefits in retirement, and that the additional requirement of continuous and uninterrupted service is no longer consistent with the changing labor markets of Albany County, and

WHEREAS, This change in vesting for health insurance will allow Albany County to remain competitive and recruit more seasoned professionals to return to County service, benefiting numerous departments and the individuals they serve, and

WHEREAS, The Albany County Legislature intends this policy be modified to allow for total aggregate years of service rather than continuous and uninterrupted years of service to control eligibility for health insurance benefits and to apply to all current and former employees of Albany County who have not yet retired from the New York State Retirement System, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Albany County Legislature that the Albany County Employee Rules and Regulations, adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 136-b for 1999, as amended, are hereby amended as follows:

Article IX, Section A(1)(a)(2) shall read: "The service indicated in eligibility criterion one (1), (above), need not be continuous and uninterrupted, [if reinstatement to County service following a period of separation was within twelve calendar months following the date of separation. In such circumstances, an employee's benefits date (as

defined by these Rules)] The aggregate total time of service shall be used to determine length of service achieved by the employee.”

Article IX, Section A(1)(a)(4)(c) shall replace “twenty” with “fifteen”

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “A” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria. On the day of separation from County service, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- 5 [calendar] aggregate total years of County service.
- Age 55 or older.
- Enrolled in County health insurance”

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “B” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria. On the day of separation from County service, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- 10 [calendar] aggregate total years of County service.
- Age 55 or older.
- Enrolled in County health insurance”

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “C” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria. On the day of separation from County service, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- 5 [calendar] aggregate total years of County service.
- Age 55 or older.

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “D” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria. On the day of separation from County service, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- Have completed 10 aggregate total years of equivalent full-time County service.
- Age 55 or older.
- Enrolled in County health insurance”

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “E” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria. On the day of separation from County service, the employee must meet all of the following criteria:

- Have completed 10 aggregate total years of equivalent full-time County service.
- Age 55 or older.
- Enrolled in County health insurance”

Article IX Retiring Part Time Employees, Group “F” part (b) shall read:

“(b) Eligibility Criteria:

- Employees must have completed fifteen (15) aggregate total years of equivalent full-time County service. Calculation of full time service uses a standard work week of not less than thirty five (35) hours per week.
- Age 55 or older.
- Enrolled in County health insurance”

RESOLUTION NO. 217

AMENDING THE RULES AND REGULATION FOR ALBANY COUNTY EMPLOYEES REGARDING COMPENSATORY TIME

Introduced: 4/8/24

By Feeney:

WHEREAS, By Resolution No. 136-b for 1999, as amended, this Honorable Body adopted the Rules and Regulations for Albany County Employees, and

WHEREAS, Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) non-covered and exempt employees of Albany County are not eligible for overtime pay for hours worked in excess of their regular scheduled work week, and

WHEREAS, Under Article V of the Rules and Regulations, Albany County has elected to compensate this class of employees with compensatory time off for hours worked in excess of forty (40) hours a week, and

WHEREAS, Compensatory time is prohibited for certain employees who are classified as non-covered or exempt including the Administrative Head of each Department, Division, Bureau, Office, Board or Commission or other Agency of the County Government appointed by the County Executive and/or County Legislature and their deputies, and

WHEREAS, The accrual of compensatory time is subject to the approval of an employee's supervisor and is entirely discretionary based on the needs of the department, and

WHEREAS, The Article II of the Rules and Regulations states that the standard workweek for each Department is set by the Department Head, and for many FLSA non-covered or exempt employees, this work week is set at 35 hours, and

WHEREAS, Since compensatory time may only accrue after an employee has worked beyond 40 hours a week (not including meal breaks), this results in some employees having to work five (5) hours in excess of their regular work week before becoming eligible to earn compensatory time, and

WHEREAS, If FLSA non-covered or exempt employees work in excess of their regular scheduled work week but fewer than 40 hours total, then they are not eligible to earn any compensatory time at all, and

WHEREAS, This is in stark contrast to FLSA non-exempt employees of Albany County, who are allowed to accrue overtime for any time worked in excess of their

regular scheduled work week and are also allowed to take said time as either compensatory time or as a cash payout, and

WHEREAS, The use of compensatory time is also restricted by prohibiting its use for more than two consecutive days, and

WHEREAS, Amending the threshold from a set 40 hours to anything in excess of the employee's standard work week and removing the two-day restriction will give employees greater opportunities to earn and use compensatory time, allowing them to attend to personal matters, spend time with family, or generally maintain a greater work/life balance, and

WHEREAS, The Albany County Legislature determines that allowing employees to be eligible to earn compensatory time for any time worked beyond their regular scheduled work week, as approved by their supervisor, and allowing employees more flexibility to use their accrued compensatory time, is more in line with the values of this Honorable Body and its support of the workforce of Albany County, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, By the Albany County Legislature that the Albany County Employee Rules and Regulations, adopted pursuant to Resolution No. 136-b for 1999, as amended, are hereby amended as follows:

Article V (sub. A(2)), is hereby amended as follows:

“2. Employees must work in excess of [40 hours in a work week, (not including meal break) regardless of] their regular scheduled work week to be eligible to accrue compensatory time credits. Only hours worked in excess of [40] their regularly scheduled work week as established by their Department Head will apply.”;

Article V(sub. A(3)(d)), is hereby amended as follows:

“d. **Use of Compensatory Time Credits.** Use of compensatory time credits shall require the prior approval of the employee's supervisor. Compensatory time credits shall be used in such increments as the supervisor shall approve. [Use of compensatory time is prohibited for any absence in excess of two (2) consecutive days.]”

Albany County Legislature Proclamation Policy

Definitions:

A proclamation is an act of proclaiming or declaring commemoration of an event or cause, recognizing extraordinary achievements of local citizens and non-profit organizations, honoring occasions of importance and significance, and/or increasing public awareness on issues pertaining to the residents of Albany County.

A proclamation is not-legally binding and should not be interpreted as a policy endorsement.

A proclamation is strictly honorary and ceremonial.

Guidelines:

Proclamations are generally issued for the following purposes:

- Memorializing special events, including national days of celebration such as a day, a week, a month (i.e. World Alzheimer's Day, Reye's Syndrome Awareness Week, Black History Month), recognition or mourning;
- Memorializing cultural and historical occasions;
- Proclamations must hold a county-wide significance or serve an educational purpose for the residents of Albany County;
- Recognizing local business anniversaries;
- Recognizing achievement of high rank (i.e. Eagle Scout) or success within a local non-profit organization, or school-related activity such as athletics, music, academics, etc.;
- Honoring local non-profit service groups or businesses for their work in the community;
- Recognizing individuals for their outstanding contribution to the community.

Proclamations will generally **not** be issued for the following purposes:

- Groups or individuals Located or residing primarily outside of Albany County;
- Events or activities that are not relevant to Albany County and its residents;
- Controversial or polarizing issues, ideological or religious beliefs;
- National or international groups requesting a proclamation;
- Urging another elected official or system of government to act on an issue or legislation.

Procedure:

All requests for proclamations issued by the Albany County Legislature must be submitted in writing *at least two weeks in advance* of the event. Submission of a proclamation request does not guarantee its issuance. The Chair may make the final decision to modify or deny any proclamation requests, except where such request has 26 signatories. Notwithstanding the above, proclamations will not be issued unless there are more than 5 legislator signatories.

Request must contain the following information:

- The name of person/organization;
- Date to be presented;
- Date needed;
- Date and location of the event or presentation;
- A brief summary and/or background of the event, organization or person;
- An indication whether the proclamation should be sent to the entire legislative body or specific legislators.

Proclamations will be distributed to members of the Legislature by the Office of Chair and returned to the sponsor by close of business on the first Friday after its submission.

Requests to sign onto proclamations will be sent to the members of the Legislature via email.

To request a hard copy of a proclamation, contact Nicolette Simmonds.

Once a proclamation is finalized and sealed, amendments thereafter will not be accepted.

Validity:

For a proclamation to be valid it has to conform to the following criteria:

- It must include the Albany County Legislature seal;
- It must be filed and received by the Clerk of the Legislature.

An invalid proclamation shall not be posted on social media and/or distributed to the public.

The member must announce their abstention prior to a vote and file with the Clerk the reason for their abstention. In such instances, the member shall remove themselves from any participation in discussion and/or debate on the subject. The names of members abstaining shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

LOCAL LAW NO. “B” FOR 2024

A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY, NEW YORK AMENDING CHAPTER 288 OF THE ALBANY COUNTY CODE TO BAN SPEED CONTESTS AND STUNT BEHAVIOR

Introduced: 2/12/24

By Miller:

A Local Law amending Chapter 288 of the Albany County Code to expand penalties for speed contests, stunt behavior, and other reckless driving behaviors that endanger Albany County residents.

BE IT ENACTED by the Albany County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. New Article Added.

This Local Law hereby amends Chapter 288 by adding a new Article IV, titled **Unlawful Speed Contests and Stunt Behavior**.

Section 2. § 288-26, Title.

This Local Law shall be known as the “STUNT Law: Safeguarding Traffic, Unlawful Racing, and Noise Transgressions.”

Section 3. § 288-27, Legislative Purpose and Intent.

This Legislature recognizes that speeding has been a significant factor in numerous motor vehicle fatalities over the past decades, with motor vehicle accidents being one of the leading causes of death for individuals aged 1 to 54.

The Legislature acknowledges the rise in popularity of illegal vehicle sideshows, demonstrations, and contests; often shared on social media, which pose a great risk to participants and spectators, leading to severe physical injuries and even death.

Moreover, illegal vehicle sideshows, contests, street racing, and related stunt behavior not only endanger lives and property but also create excessive noise during night hours, causing disturbances for residents in neighboring areas.

The current penalties for these illegal activities are insufficient in deterring individuals from participating in them.

Therefore, the purpose of this Local Law is to protect Albany County residents by expanding and strengthening laws and penalties related to unlawful speed contests, sideshows, and related stunt behavior.

Section 4. § 288-28, Definitions.

As used in this Local Law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

“Burnout” – To spin a vehicle’s wheel(s) while keeping the vehicle stationary, causing the tires to heat up and emit smoke.

“Drifting” – The intentional oversteering of a vehicle with loss of traction while maintaining control, resulting in a controlled skid or power slide through a turn.

“Doughnut” – A maneuver performed by rotating the rear or front of a vehicle around the opposite set of wheels, creating a circular skid mark pattern on the road surface[, also known as a “wheelie.”]

“Revving” – To rapidly increase the engine speed while a vehicle is stationary or in neutral, producing loud noise and/or causing the vehicle to jerk or lurch.

“Sideshow” – An event in which vehicles gather and engage in reckless behavior, such as performing stunts, burnouts, doughnuts/wheelies, drifting, and/or other dangerous maneuvers.

“Street Racing” – The act of racing or competing with one or more vehicles on a public highway, street, or road, whether prearranged or spontaneous.

“Stunt Behavior” – Performing any maneuver with a vehicle that is not part of normal driving or exceeds the safe limits of the vehicle; including but not limited to stunts, revving, burnout, drifting, doughnuts, acrobatic maneuvers, jumps, and other similar actions.

“Wheelie” -- Raising a vehicle to the degree that one or more wheels lose contact with the ground.

Section 5. § 288-29, Prohibitions.

(A) No person shall knowingly participate in, engage in, organize, facilitate, coordinate, plan, aid, or abet any street race, sideshow, contest, exhibition, or stunt behavior involving vehicles upon any public highway, street, sidewalk, public parking lot or area, or any other public property within Albany County.

(B) No person shall knowingly obstruct or attempt to obstruct any public highway, street, or road with a motor vehicle or any other object used as a blockade for the purpose of permitting any such race, sideshow, contest, exhibition, or stunt behavior.

Section 6. § 288-30, Enforcement and Penalties for Offenses.

(A) Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500 for a first offense, and a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding 15 days, or both, for each subsequent offense.

(B) Any person who causes physical injury to another person or damage to real or personal property while violating any provision of this article shall be liable for the payment of restitution, as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 7. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision, or other part of this local law or its application shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of the local law which shall remain in full force and effect except as limited by such order or judgment.

Section 8. SEQRA Compliance.

This County Legislature determines that this local law constitutes a “Type II action” pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and that no further action under SEQRA is required.

Section 9. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately following its filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW “D” FOR 2024

A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY, NEW YORK CREATING CHAPTER 182 OF THE ALBANY COUNTY CODE, PROHIBITING FALSE AND MISLEADING STATEMENTS BY CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTERS

Introduced: 4/8/24

By Plotsky, Reidy, McLean Lane, Cunningham, McLaughlin, Lekakis and Pedo:

A local law creating Chapter 182 (Healthcare) of the Albany County Code to prohibit inaccurate and misleading statements and advertising by crisis pregnancy centers in Albany County.

BE IT ENACTED by the Albany County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. Title.

This local law hereby creates Chapter 182, **Healthcare**.

Section 2. Crisis Pregnancy Centers

This local law hereby creates Chapter 182, Article 1, **Crisis Pregnancy Centers**.

Section 3. § 182-1 - Legislative Purpose and Intent.

New York has traditionally protected access to reproductive services, including abortion care. In 2022, the United States Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, ending legal abortion in states throughout the country. However, over the years, anti-abortion facilities often affiliated with religious groups have appeared throughout New York. These facilities are often referred to as crisis pregnancy centers (CPCs).

In New York, crisis pregnancy centers outnumber abortion clinics – there are 120 of these crisis pregnancy centers compared with 74 abortion clinics, with 8 crisis pregnancy centers located in Albany County. None of these crisis pregnancy centers are licensed medical facilities, and their staff are not licensed medical professionals. These facilities attempt to convey the impression that they are medical clinics – often dressing staff in scrubs and lab coats and setting the centers up with “exam rooms” with medical equipment, where staff perform ultrasounds – yet the facilities and their staff are exempt from the regulatory, licensure, credentialing and ethical oversight that applies to health care facilities and professionals, and are also not subject to rules related to informed consent, client confidentiality, or the privacy provisions of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

In 2022, a study of CPCs in New York State by a team of researchers at Albany Medical Center found that, in an initial call to CPCs to explore options for an unplanned pregnancy, 76% percent of CPCs provided medically-inaccurate

information about the precision of urine pregnancy tests and ultrasound testing, the safety of various abortion options and possibility of “abortion reversal”, and/or gave inflammatory misinformation about abortion procedures. Pregnant women have been told that abortions can cause breast cancer, mental health issues and infertility, and that abortion is dangerous or even deadly – all of which have been medically disproven.

These levels of inaccuracy and misinformation are lower than in other states where abortion rights are not protected, but remain unacceptably high for Albany County residents. The actions of these non-medical facilities and non-medical professionals directly impacts the ability of Albany County women to obtain accurate, non-coercive health care information and timely access to available reproductive and sexual health care services. As such, this Legislature finds that there is a clear need to regulate false and misleading statements and advertising by crisis pregnancy centers in Albany County.

Section 4. § 182-2 - Definitions.

1) “Abortion” and/or “Abortion care” means any intervention intended to terminate a pregnancy so that it does not result in a live birth.

2) “Client” means an individual who is inquiring about or seeking services at a pregnancy services center, whether in person, via the internet, or via telephone or text communication.

3) “Health information” means any oral or written information in any form or medium that relates to health insurance and/or the past, present, or future physical or mental health or condition of a client.

4) “Crisis pregnancy center” means a facility or entity, including a mobile facility, the primary purpose of which is to provide services to clients who are or may be pregnant, that:

A) Either

(1) is not a health care facility licensed by the State of New York under Article 28 of the Public Health Law or Articles 31 and 32 of the Mental Hygiene Law; or

(2) is not providing services under the direction of a health care provider licensed under Title 8 of the Education Law who is acting within his or her scope of practice; and

B) Either

(1) offers obstetric ultrasounds, obstetric sonograms, and/or prenatal care to pregnant women; or

(2) has the appearance of a medical facility; and

C) fails to provide or refer for the full range of comprehensive reproductive and sexual health care services reimbursed under the New York's Medicaid

program including, but not limited to contraception, testing and treatment of sexually transmitted infections, abortion care, and prenatal care.

A facility or entity has the appearance of a medical facility if two or more of the following factors are present:

- a) The facility offers pregnancy testing and/or pregnancy diagnosis;
- b) The facility has staff or volunteers who wear medical attire or uniforms, including but not limited to scrubs or lab coats;
- c) The facility contains one or more examination tables;
- d) The facility contains a private or semi-private room or area containing medical supplies and/or medical instruments;
- e) The facility has staff or volunteers who collect health information from clients; or
- f) The facility is located on the same premises as a state-licensed medical facility or provider or shares facility space with a state-licensed medical provider.

5) “Medically-inaccurate information” means information which contravenes medically-accurate information.

6) “Medically-accurate information” means information which is verified or supported by research conducted in compliance with scientific methods and published in peer-reviewed journals, where appropriate, and recognized as accurate and objective by professional organizations and agencies with expertise in the relevant field, such as the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the American Public Health Association, and the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists.

Section 5. § 182-3 – Prohibition on False Advertising.

- A. It shall be unlawful for any crisis pregnancy center to disseminate or cause to be disseminated to Albany County residents or visitors, or to disseminate to the public anywhere from Albany County, any advertising about the services or proposed services performed at that center if the management and/or staff of the center knows or, by the exercise of reasonable care, ought to know such information is untrue or is clearly designed to mislead the public about the nature of services provided at the facility.
- B. Advertising shall include representations made directly to consumers; marketing practices; communication in any print medium such as newspapers, magazines, mailers or handouts; any broadcast medium such as television or radio, telephone marketing; and/or advertising over the Internet such as through websites, web ads and search engine results.

Section 6. § 182-4 – Prohibition on Inaccurate and Fraudulent Statements to Clients.

A. It shall be unlawful for any crisis pregnancy center to disseminate or cause to be disseminated to Albany County clients or those clients who have travelled to Albany County:

- a. any medically-inaccurate information about the accuracy or precision of urine pregnancy tests and ultrasound testing;
- b. any medically-inaccurate information about the client's then current pregnancy status, including the then current length or date of the pregnancy;
- c. any medically-inaccurate information about the possibility of medically disproven cancers, mental health issues and/or infertility or sterility due to undergoing legal abortion procedures and care;
- d. any medically-inaccurate information about the procedures of legal abortion procedures and care;
- e. any medically-inaccurate information about the safety of legal abortion procedures and care;
- f. and any medically-inaccurate information about the possibility of "abortion reversal treatment"

if the owner, operator, management and/or staff of the center knows or, by the exercise of reasonable care, ought to know that such information is untrue or is clearly designed to mislead clients about their medical options and the nature of services provided at the facility, and if the owner, operator, management and/or staff of the center intends for clients to rely on such information.

B. It shall be unlawful for any crisis pregnancy center to disseminate or cause to be disseminated to Albany County clients or those clients who have travelled to Albany County any medically-inaccurate information or legally-inaccurate information about the timing or gestational age of a pregnancy as it relates to the ability of a client to obtain abortion care in New York State if the owner, operator, management and/or staff of the center intends for clients to rely on such information.

C. Intent requirements under this Local Law shall be defined as state in Penal Law § 15.05.

Section 7. § 182-5 – Notice Requirement.

All crisis pregnancy centers located within Albany County must post a notice on the premises, in a location clearly noticeable from the waiting area(s) and examination area(s), stating:

- i. That the facility is not a medical facility.
- ii. That there is not a licensed medical doctor, registered nurse, or other licensed medical practitioner on regular staff at the center directing the medical care of clients; and

iii. Whether abortion care, emergency contraception, or referrals for abortion care and/or emergency contraception are available at or provided by the center; and

iv. That abortion care, emergency contraception, and referrals for abortion care or emergency contraception are legal pursuant to New York law.

Section 8. § 182-6 - Enforcement.

A. Albany County may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction for injunctive relief compelling compliance with any provision of this Local Law and correcting the effects of the false, misleading, and/or deceptive statements or advertising.

B. Such an injunction may require a crisis pregnancy center to:

a) Pay for and disseminate appropriate corrective statements to clients including medically accurate information provided by a licensed medical professional.

b) Pay for and disseminate appropriate corrective advertising in the same form as the false, misleading, or deceptive advertising.

c) Any other relief that the court deems necessary to remedy the adverse effects of the false, misleading, or deceptive advertising on clients seeking pregnancy-related services.

C. Upon a finding by a court of competent jurisdiction that a crisis pregnancy center has violated this Local Law, Albany County shall be entitled to recover civil penalties from each party responsible for the violation of not less than \$500 and not more than \$5,000 per violation. In addition, if Albany County prevails it shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs pursuant to order of the court.

D. Nothing in this section shall be interpreted as restricting, precluding or otherwise limiting a separate or concurrent criminal prosecution under New York State Penal Law § 190.20.

Section 9. Severability

The provisions of this Act shall be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence or provision is declared to be invalid or is preempted by Federal or State law or regulation, the validity of the remainder of this Act shall not be affected.

Section 10. SEQRA Compliance.

This County Legislature determines that this local law constitutes a "Type II action" pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and that no further action under SEQRA is required.

Section 11. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately after its filing with the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW “E” FOR 2024

A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY, NEW YORK AMENDING CHAPTER 146 OF THE ALBANY COUNTY CODE TO INCLUDE A PROHIBITION ON THE USAGE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE ASH IN PRODUCTS

Introduced: 4/8/24

By Reinhardt and Simpson:

BE IT ENACTED by the Albany County Legislature as follows:

Section 1. § 146-34 – Title.

This local law hereby creates Chapter 146, Article 5, **Prohibition on Usage of Hazardous Waste Ash.**

Section 2. § 146-35 - Legislative Purpose and Intent.

The Albany County Legislature hereby finds and determines that the incineration of hazardous waste produces fly ash, flue gas emission control waste, and slag (hereinafter collectively as "hazardous waste ash"). Hazardous waste ash may contain chemicals and heavy metals such as arsenic, barium, cadmium, chromium, lead, mercury, and nickel, which are all potentially toxic to humans and are known to cause or contribute to cancer, lung and heart ailments, liver and kidney damage, neurological damage, and premature mortality.

Hazardous waste ash may also contain mineralogical toxins such as fine crystalline when the feedstock to the industrial process contain silica. Fine particulate crystalline silica induces silicosis when inhaled and is a known respiratory health risk. Hazardous waste ash may be inhaled and become lodged in the deepest parts of the human respiratory system, leading to potentially fatal inflammation and immunological reactions. Fine particulate crystalline silica can induce silicosis and lung cancer separate from silicosis and smoking when inhaled and is a known health risk for chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) and kidney disease.

Under certain existing commercial practices, hazardous waste ash is included in aggregate material used to formulate commonly encountered compounds such as concrete, pavement, and other compounds found in commerce. The inclusion of hazardous waste ash in aggregate material and commonly encountered compounds exposes the public to potentially toxic substances and endangers public health.

Section 3. § 146-36 – Definitions.

"Aggregate" -- any natural or artificial mixture typically consisting of but not limited to sand, gravel, crushed stone, vermiculite, clinker, expanded or sintered clay or

shale, foamed slag, or recycled concrete or asphalt that is used as an ingredient in compound materials.

"Product" -- any aggregate, compound, item, substance, material, component, system, or subsystem sold or traded or produced for sale or trade to the general public in the course of normal business operations.

"Compound" -- asphalt concrete, portland cement concrete, concrete block, structural concrete, unreinforced or lightweight concrete, or any other substance composed of aggregate that is used in construction and engineering applications.

"Fine-Particle Control Device" -- any apparatus, structure, or method of filtration that falls into any of the following general categories:

- (i) fabric filters, also known as baghouses or bag filters;
- (ii) electrostatic collectors, including dry and wet electrostatic precipitators and ionizing wet scrubbers;
- (iii) wet inertial-impaction collectors, including venturi scrubbers and advanced designs that use flux-force condensation-enhancement techniques; or
- (iv) cyclone separators or any other apparatus, structure, or method that is capable of separating fine particles from gas.

"Flue Gas Emission Control Waste" -- the particulates recovered from fine-particle control devices and other receptacles during the treatment of flue gas.

"Fly Ash" -- the fine, lightweight particulates that are transported from the combustion chamber by flue gases into exhaust stacks or other receptacles.

"Hazardous Waste Ash" -- fly ash, flue gas emission control waste, and slag produced as a byproduct of incineration of hazardous waste.

"Slag" -- the molten or once-molten ash that collects on fine-particle control devices or other receptacles as well as chunks in bottom ash.

"Person" -- any individual, public or private corporation, industry, co-partnership, association, firm, trust, estate or private legal entity.

Section 4. § 146-37 - Prohibition on Usage of Hazardous Waste Ash in Products.

No person shall mix, combine or blend hazardous waste ash with any product. This prohibition shall also apply to any material collected from fine-particle control devices serving as pollution control or containment systems at any hazardous waste incinerator or kiln that is permitted by the department to receive and combust hazardous waste with or without energy recovery.

Section 5. § 146-38 - Enforcement.

Any person or entity who violates the provisions of this Local Law shall be subject to the imposition of a civil penalty by the Commissioner of Health of not more than \$5,000 for a first violation, \$10,000 for a second violation, and \$20,000 for each violation thereafter.

The civil penalties provided by this section shall be recoverable in an action instituted in the name of the County of Albany. The County of Albany may also institute a suit in equity where unlawful conduct exists for an injunction to restrain a violation of this Local Law.

Section 6. Severability

The provisions of this Act shall be severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence or provision is declared to be invalid or is preempted by Federal or State law or regulation, the validity of the remainder of this Act shall not be affected.

Section 7. SEQRA Compliance.

This County Legislature determines that this local law constitutes a “Type II action” pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and that no further action under SEQRA is required.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This Local Law act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall have become a law.

LOCAL LAW NO. F FOR 2024

A LOCAL LAW OF THE COUNTY OF ALBANY, NEW YORK AMENDING CHAPTER 270 OF THE ALBANY COUNTY CODE TO PROVIDE A REAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION FOR LIVING QUARTERS FOR PARENT OR GRANDPARENT

Introduced: 4/8/24

By Cunningham:

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the County of Albany as follows:

SECTION I. Article Creation.

Chapter 270, Article XX, **Auxiliary Dwelling Unit Exemption**, is hereby created

SECTION II. § 270-166 Legislative Intent and Purpose.

a. The Albany County Legislature recognizes the role of the family in the care of the aging and the contribution to family life that can be made by encouraging the aging to share their decades of wisdom and experience with the youth of their families.

b. The Legislature finds and determines that it is desirable for parents and grandparents to age in place and remain in the care of their family.

c. The Legislature further finds and determines that it is the best social and economic interest of the County of Albany to encourage the care of the aging be provided within the family, where appropriate.

d. The Legislature further finds and determines that real property tax exemptions are an appropriate way to assist with the financial burden of caring for a parent or grandparent in the comfort of one's own home.

e. The purpose of this Local Law is to legislatively adopt the real property tax exemption provided for the living quarters of a parent or grandparent in accordance with Section 469 of the Real Property Tax Law to read as follows:

SECTION III. § 270-167 Definitions.

For the purposes of this Local Law, the term "parent or grandparent" shall be deemed to include the birth or adoptive grandparents and parents of the owner or the spouse of the owner.

SECTION IV. § 270-168 Real Property Tax Exemption.

The County of Albany does hereby provide for an exemption from taxation to the extent of any increase in assessed value of residential property resulting from the construction or reconstruction of such property for the purpose of providing living quarters for a parent or grandparent, who is sixty-two years of age or older.

SECTION V. § 270-169 Computation of Exemption.

Such exemption shall not exceed (a) the increase in assessed value resulting from construction or reconstruction of such property, or (b) twenty percent of the total assessed value of such property as improved, or (c) twenty percent of the median sale price of residential property as reported in the most recent sales statistical summary published by the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance for the county in which the property is located, whichever is less.

Such exemption shall be applicable only to construction or reconstruction which occurred subsequent to January 1, 2023 and shall only apply during taxable years during which at least one such parent or grandparent maintains a primary place of residence in such living quarters.

SECTION VI. § 270-170 Conditions on Exemption.

No such exemption shall be granted unless:

- (1) The property is within the geographical area in which such construction or reconstruction is permitted; and
- (2) The residential property so constructed or reconstructed is the principal place of residence of the owner; and
- (3) The construction or reconstruction was certified as complete through the issuance of a certificate of occupancy or a certificate of completion by the municipal building department with responsibility for town or city in which the construction or reconstruction has occurred; and
- (4) The certificate of occupancy or certificate of completion was issued on or after January 1, 2023.

SECTION VII. § 270-171 Application for Exemption.

Such exemption from taxation shall be granted upon an application made annually, upon a form promulgated by the New York State Commissioner of Taxation and Finance, by the owner of such property to the assessor of the city, town, or village having the power to assess property for taxation on or before the appropriate taxable status date of such city, town or village. If the assessor is satisfied that the property is entitled to an exemption pursuant to real property tax law section 469, they shall approve the application and such residential improvements shall be exempt from taxation and special ad valorem levies as provided by this Local Law.

Any conviction of having made any willful false statement in the application for such exemption shall result in the revocation thereof, be punishable by a civil

penalty of not more than one hundred dollars and shall disqualify the applicant or applicants from further exemption for a period of five years.

SECTION VIII. § 270-172 Effective Date.

This Local Law shall take effect on January 1, 2025 and shall apply to taxable status dates occurring on or after such date.
