Bruce Hidley reads the details of the contract. Erin Stachewicz states they received federal article grant funding that came to was pass through to the New York State Office of Children Family Services. A portion of this money, they are looking to purchase the two plug in hybrids. They went out to bid and received four (4) quotes. Metro Ford was the lowest bidder for the two plug in hybrids. They have often been faced with having to move individuals from either evictions or locations that they can no longer reside because of their situation. So they have to move their belongings with them to any new location. They see at least 60 investigations a month that we must go out and that are ongoing for at least 60 days or more. They have 45 staff who go out and do visits consistently, not only with new cases but their ongoing guardianship cases which some are local and some are not in this area, they're out of the state, some of them placed in long term care facilities. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Joanne Cunningham makes a motion and Mike McLaughlin seconds the motion. The motion is carried.

David Reilly states this is to replace the switching hardware up at DSS up on Washington Avenue with its newer and more efficient technology, so each switch can handle twice the bandwidth. There will be less maintenance or crews have to do also and expect a longer lifespan. These are at an end of life. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Joanne Cunningham makes a motion and Mike McLaughlin seconds the motion. The motion is carried.

David Reilly states this is simply the annual subscription for the Legistar system also referred to as Granicus. It's used mostly by the Executive's department to submit pending legislation or requested legislation to the legislature itself. Then the legislature can use it to kind of track it through their system, add their notes to things up until passage. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Mike McLaughlin makes a motion and Joanne Cunningham seconds the motion. The motion is carried.

Bruce Hidley reads the details of the contract. David Reilly states the lengthy scope of service was simply to lay out that this is actually providing three services in one contract with the same vendor because we'd already reached out originally with it during the security, which is the large piece of \$30,000 HR a couple of years ago had tagged on, they also do their sexual harassment training and do all the bookkeeping record keeping on the back side of the short compliance. Plus, there's also an email phishing simulation package that goes out there where test emails are sent out to the employees. So all necessary parts of our data security at this point in time. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Mike McLaughlin makes a motion and Joanne Cunningham seconds the motion. The motion is carried.

Bruce Hidley reads the details of the contract. Cameron Sagan states this will work in tandem with funding that was made available to the Food Bank of Northeastern New York. It's been highlighted before but the meal gap is a real issue that exists in Albany County and has only been made worse by the COVID pandemic and the lingering financial impacts of it. So this would ensure that those not local nonprofits that provide essential services as well as meals are supported by United Way. They'd also work with local partners, innovative strategies that will support. The cooking program is one example where you're leveraging a cooking program that's also going to provide meals to those in need. Given the unique nature of the issue that we're dealing with when it comes to hunger and the unique proposal, this was determined to be sole source. Joanne Cunningham asks if the funding goes to United Way as far as the grant and they then supply funding to existing partners who supply meals with other. Cameron responds that they will also be part of the providing of the meals. They will also leverage existing kitchens. Joanne asks if through this grant, will you be able to say we provided X number of meals in addition to what they have already. Cameron responds that there are meals provided by the food bank, but then organizations such as the Boys and Girls Club don't receive that, those meals are from the food bank. Joanne asks if this would sort of fill that gap. Cameron responds that he is unsure if in it's entirety but they will be looking at that for sure. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Mike McLaughlin makes a motion and Joanne Cunningham seconds the motion. The motion is carried.

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Mr. Hidley entertains a motion to bundle contracts number 1837 through 1845. Mike McLaughlin makes a motion and Joanne Cunningham seconds the motion. The motion is carried to bundle the contracts. Mr. Hidley reads the details of the contract(s). Eugenia Condon states as a result of loss of staff in the County Attorney's office and the inability to hire despite attempts to hire litigation staff, we are facing a issue. We have several matters that are scheduled, being scheduled for trial or nearing trial and we are at the stage where we need help in preparing these matters and going to trial. As a result, they issued a request for proposals for outside counsel. They received quotes from the non law firms in this pile. They are all very good law firms with experience in a wide variety of areas of law. The proposal that is before you is for up to the amount of the jurisdiction of the Contract Administration Board. They are requesting a contract with each of the firms in the event that we need them for services. There is a possibility that they may award a contract to a firm and they may not use them, but would like the ability to be able to assign a firm to handle the matter for us. If we're served with a notice of claim or someone's a complaint, they need to be able to send it out in the event that a matter is dire and assistance is needed with having the matter handled. They presently have one matter that's being scheduled for trial and it needs to be able to be assigned to outside counsel. Many of the firms on this list, the vast majority of them they had used previously when they used outside counsel, frankly, the fees that are being charged that are in my memo are very similar to the fees that were charged to us 10 to 15 years ago. They have not gone up significantly. They are going to be assigned on an as needed basis. They do not anticipate this to be a regular recurring basis. They have litigation attorneys in their office. They do not have trial counsel. They have one attorney part time who was able to do trials at this point who was trained to do trials, but we need assistance in that area. The other concern is if they are served with a matter that is beyond their expertise, or that is so complex that they need to send it out, Eugenia needs to be able to send something out quickly. She is asking for authority to contract with these firms not to exceed and there is a possibility that some of these firms may not be assigned anything. This is very similar to how procurement of legal firms and assignments were handled previously. When they didn't handle any of the litigation in house, they were assigned on as they came in based upon their expertise. These would essentially be on retainer if something comes up as needed. Joanne Cunningham asks if the costs associated with these firms require a monthly retainer to maintain these relationships. Eugenia responds with no, it is for services rendered. Joanne asks how many attorneys are they short because this is \$900,000 potentially. Eugenia states it could actually be depending upon what we send out potentially. so John Liguori, who had been the Deputy County Attorney was the major lead on litigation. He left in January and we have not been able to replace his expertise or his role in the office as far as overseeing litigation. Mark Houston also left and he was a part time Real Property Litigation Attorney. That was a major hit for us. We currently have, 2.5 attorneys left in the litigation unit including the litigation supervisor who is part time, because the remainder of the part time she's in family court. Joanne confirms that they are down two attorneys. Eugenia states John was the supervisor who ultimately oversaw everything. Joanne proceeds to ask what Eugenia does regarding, are there normally nine contracts. Eugenia states up until this time, they had none previously, before 12 years ago when they used outside counsel. Yes, they used to issue every four years and Law issued RFP's and for the most part, the firms that would issue proposals, so long as their fees met the criteria. They met the criteria in so far as the firms being the type of firm that could provide the services and their fees not being extraordinary. They requested authorization to contract with every firm. It does not necessarily mean that they would be awarded anything or that they would be awarded the amount that they were requesting. It just meant that they would have them on retainer to be assigned a case as needed.

Continued\* Joanne asks how they are doing as far as recruitment. Eugenia responds they have another vacancy in their family court unit. That's been vacant since November they have posted on indeed, they have had multiple interviews, multiple postings. They tend to get to the point they get like other departments, this is typical of the legal departments. They get what look to be promising resumes. They do an initial interview and then it comes to Eugenia and the Deputy to do a second interview and they don't call us back. We had several candidates that seemed to be promising and they just don't call us back. We don't hear anything else. Joanne asks if the family court attorney mentioned, is that in addition to the two litigators and does she see these contracts filling a gap in family court. Eugenia responds no, in family court, they will continue to be one person down until they can fill that position. Joanne asks if these contracts are mainly for things like litigation that the county is engaged in and Eugenia states this is insurance for litigation matters. Mr. Hidley entertains a motion. Mike McLaughlin makes a motion and Joanne Cunningham seconds the motion. The motion is carried.
