Department for Children, Youth and Families Backup Material to amend the Resolution 2019-378 for Contractual Arrangement with the Albany County Department of Probation

The Department for Children, Youth and Families (DCYF) is requesting legislative authorization to amend resolution 2019-378 for contractual agreement with the Albany County Department of Probation for the provision of prevention services and supervision and treatment services for juveniles. The term of the contract will be January 1, 2020 – December 31, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$1,127,700.00.

The Department received Legislative approval via Resolution 2019-378 to enter into an agreement with the Albany County Probation Department in the amount of \$676,606 for the period of January 1, 2020-December 31, 2020.

Subsequent to the approved resolution, through the approved 2019 Albany County Raise the Age Plan (approved by State Department of Budget), there was an additional \$451,094.00 to provide RTA services and programming and service. As such, the total amount of the agreement between DCYF and Probation for January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020 is now \$1,127,700.00.

Due to this increase, the Department requests amending resolution 2019-378, AA3140 03314 from \$676,606 to \$1,127,700.00, an increase of \$451,094.00

There has been a historical relationship between these two County Departments as it relates to the provision of prevention services and supervision and treatment services for juveniles. The contract funding will be used to offset the salary and fringe benefit costs for Probation employees as well as services for programs in the Juvenile Community Accountability Board, PINS 18 and Juvenile Release Under Supervision. All of these programs are an effort to reduce the likelihood of the youth's further penetration in the Juvenile Justice system.

The Department respectfully requests Legislative authorization to contract with The Research Foundation for the State University of New York, University at Albany for the period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 in the amount of \$51,038.

Via Resolution 2019-536, the Department received Legislative approval to sign and submit a Supervision and Treatment Services for Juvenile Program Plan (STSJP) to NYS OCFS. The total funding allocation is \$172,722 for the term of October 1, 2019 – September 30, 2020.

NYS Supervision and Treatment Services for Juveniles Program (STSJP) provides funding to support local programming to divert youth safely from unnecessary detention and/or placement admissions. It is a key element of New York's juvenile justice reform efforts. STSJP funding is allocated to each locality by NYS OCFS to support programming for juvenile justice involved youth. The goal of this programming is to prevent out of home placement of youth, maintain them safely in their community, and when placement is needed, to safely expedite the reintegration of such youth back into the community.

Through this allocation, Albany would continue to support the research component through The Research Foundation for the State University of New York, University at Albany to consistently track and assess outcomes and goals as it pertains to detention, placements and reductions in racial and ethnic disparities.

Approval is requested to enter into agreements with thirteen NYS approved providers for Expanded In Home Services to the Elderly Program (EISEP) and Title XX services. EISEP and Title XX home care services are provided to eligible persons to allow them to remain in their own home, thus precluding or delaying more costly nursing home care. Eligibility requirements are as follows:

- Individuals who are at least 60 years old and:
- In need of assistance with an Activity of Daily Living or two Instrumental Activities of Daily Living;
- Able to be maintained safely at home; and
- Not be eligible for the same services under Medicaid.

Eligibility requirements for consumer directed EISEP include those provided above, as well as:

- Be capable of making choices regarding their In-home services;
- Be capable of hiring, training, and supervising the in-home services worker; and
- Understand the impact of their choices, and assume responsibility for the results of these choices, or delegate authority to another who is capable of these tasks

EISEP consumers have the option to choose to receive services under traditional home care or through consumer direction. Consumers or their representatives who receive services under the consumer directed in-home services

model will have the responsibility for interviewing, selecting, scheduling, training, supervising and dismissing the inhome services worker.

Under the Consumer Directed Personal Assistance Program (CDPAP), NYS approved providers will act as fiscal intermediary and paymaster of record for home aides delivering in-home services to EISEP clients. The providers will deliver or arrange for local assistance, quality assurance as well as facilitate peer support for eligible recipients electing to utilize the CDPAP option.

Albany County Department of Social Services (DSS) contracts with all interested & qualified agencies to provide EISEP and/or Title XX services, thus there is no RFP. In addition, New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) establishes the provider-specific recommended rates allowed for each level of service provision for each provider. The County will use the recommended Medicaid rate as a general rule, however, will not be limited by that rate under extenuating circumstances. EISEP services are provided to patients in the community under a NYS Office for the Aging Grant. 233 clients are currently being served under the EISEP Program.

The Department of Social Services respectfully requests legislative approval for the following:

Approval is requested to contract with the New York State Industries for the Disabled (NYSID) for the provision of laundry services as an ancillary service under the Expanded In Home Services to the Elderly Program (EISEP). Currently EISEP funding is received through the Albany County Department for Aging via NYS funding and will, in part, be utilized to provide these ancillary laundry services. NYSID will subcontract with Plaza Linens to provide the laundry bags, pick up, delivery, cleaning and processing of laundry.

This expanded service will provide an opportunity for older adults and individuals with disabilities, who are not eligible for EISEP or Medicaid services, to make arrangements directly with Plaza Linens through a private pay option. This will delay or reduce their need to apply for governmental programs.

Date of Adoption:

Approval is requested to contract with the New York State Industries for the Disabled (NYSID) for the provision of laundry services as an ancillary service under the Expanded In Home Services to the Elderly Program (EISEP). Currently EISEP funding is received through the Albany County Department for Aging via NYS funding and will, in part, be utilized to provide these ancillary laundry services. NYSID will subcontract with Plaza Linens to provide the laundry bags, pick up, delivery, cleaning and processing of laundry.

2/11/19, 7/8/19

This expanded service will provide an opportunity for older adults and individuals with disabilities, who are not eligible for EISEP or Medicaid services, to make arrangements directly with Plaza Linens through a private pay option. This will delay or reduce their need to apply for governmental programs, further providing Albany County with some overall savings.

Ancillary services shall be provided only to EISEP clients pursuant to a care plan and expenditures for ancillary services may only be made if no other payment source is available. EISEP home care and ancillary services are provided to eligible persons to allow them to remain in their own home, thus precluding or delaying more costly nursing home care. EISEP services are provided to approximately 223 individuals with 98 clients in the community using Plaza Linens for laundry services.

Albany County is able to contract directly with NYSID as a New York State Preferred Source Vendor without having to issue an RFP.

EXHIBIT 1

Scope of Services

Albany County continues to strive to provide cost effective types of services most needed and preferred by older adults to keep them in their homes and assist them in avoiding more costly institutional care. One of these services will be the provision of laundry pick-up, cleaning and delivery as an ancillary service through the EISEP program.

Eligibility

These ancillary services under the EISEP program shall be provided only in accordance with a care plan established by Albany County. Albany County will assess, at least annually, the need for ancillary services. An annual assessment enables Albany County to be certain that the services and items provided to each client are appropriate and continue to meet the clients' needs. If an assessment determines a client is no longer eligible for laundry pick-up and delivery or the client needs an increase or decrease in the frequency of laundry pick-up and delivery, The Department will notify the Provider immediately.

Any new client names and addresses will be provided to the Provider for service.

Laundry Bags

- The Provider will provide laundry bag(s) sufficient to hold 5 lbs. of laundry for each client.
- The Provider shall be responsible for marking the bags with each client's name.
- The client shall be responsible for marking and personalizing any individual clothing/laundry items.
- Bags must be kept in well-maintained condition. Damaged bags must be repaired or replaced immediately by the Provider.

Equipment, Supplies and Sanitation

- The Provider's laundry facility must be operated and maintained in a safe and sanitary manner in conformance with all applicable local, State and federal laws or regulations, whether known now or revised or adopted during the term of the contract. This requirement includes, but is not limited to, the Provider's obligation to demonstrate the existence of an effective pest control program.
- The Provider shall make available, upon request, copies of any Quality Assurance forms, licenses, certifications or test results that may be submitted to or required by any local, State or Federal regulatory agency.

- The Provider shall furnish all equipment, utilities, supplies, work space, and will provide all management and labor necessary for the efficient, sanitary and ecologically sound provision of the laundry services.
- Only branded quality detergents and cleaning materials are to be used for laundry.
- The Provider shall clean and process each client's laundry, including occasional heavily soiled and contaminated materials requiring special separate handling.
- The Provider must process the laundry under established quality standards to ensure maximum sanitary, safety and comfort for individual use.
- The Provider must ensure the separation of clean and soiled laundry at all times.
- The Provider must protect all clean laundry from all sources of cross contamination. Care will be taken that items are not subjected to unnecessary strain or tear.
- The Provider shall fold, stack and package laundry for delivery in a manner to ensure a minimum of wrinkling.

Damaged Items

The Provider will be responsible for any damage to client's laundry caused by its staff while performing duties under this contract. Such damage is the responsibility of the Provider and payment for such damage shall be payable to the client (customer) upon receipt of a detailed statement. The Provider must reimburse for all lost or damaged items according to the standard scale in Exhibit II below:

Personal Property, Rewashing and Laundry Item Repairs

- All client's personal items/property (false teeth, eye glasses, slippers, jewelry etc.) or
 money that may be found in the soiled laundry shall be returned with the clean linen
 delivery. Any found items should be wrapped in a separate, clear plastic bag or container.
- Items failing to meet the client's washing standards will be returned for rewash at no cost to the client or the County. The Provider will label rewash as such.
- If there are occasions when the client may request the Provider to make repair of laundry items (i.e. lost button, new zipper, etc.), terms and prices will be determined by mutual agreement of the Provider and the client. The County will not be responsible for costs associated with repair of laundry items.

Pickup and Delivery Schedule

- Laundry for pick-up and delivery will be packed in Provider supplied laundry bags and clearly labeled with individual client's name.
- For a set number of clients, Provider shall provide pick-up and return delivery services within 48 hours.
- Any increase or decrease in the frequency of laundry pickup and delivery service for an individual client requires approval by The Department.
- The Department reserves the right to request adjustments to said pickup and delivery schedule, including adjustments based on patient care demands and changes in funding.

Criminal Background Checks

- Provider shall conduct criminal background checks on all employees and sub-contractors
 who will be responsible for picking up and delivering laundry to older adults and
 individuals with disabilities under this contract.
- Provider agrees that no employee or subcontractor convicted of a crime, whether a felony or a misdemeanor, shall be authorized to perform any laundry pick-up or delivery work under the terms of this contract.
- The costs related to criminal background checks shall be paid by the Provider.
- County has the right to request removal of any Provider employee or subcontractor who does not properly conduct himself/herself/itself or perform quality work.

Employee Identification

For security and safety purposes, all the Provider's employees must wear a clearly displayed photo identification badge (provided by the Provider at the Provider's cost) and Provider work uniforms/jackets showing they are employees of the Provider.

Cost Share Policy

- In accordance with New York State Regulations, EISEP clients are required to cost share according to a sliding scale based on their income and the cost of the services they receive.
- A listing of clients along with cost share amounts will be provided to the Provider by The Department.
- The Department will notify clients in writing what their cost share responsibility is for laundry pick-up and delivery services.
- The Provider, will be required to bill and collect directly from clients any cost share they
 are responsible for under the laundry pick-up and delivery service under the EISEP
 program.
- The Provider must keep an itemized accounting of all cost share funds received.
- All cost share funds must be used for program expenses.

Billing Basis

The Provider shall bill The Department for services rendered based on one (1) five (5) pound bag of laundry, per individual client, per week. Should the client require an additional bag, the Provider agrees to bill an additional \$10 per bag. Any client who is authorized by the County to receive laundry pick-up and delivery twice a week shall be noted accordingly.

The Provider shall issue invoices to clients with cost share on a monthly basis and be responsible for collecting those fees on applicable clients. This fee will be deducted from the bill submitted by NYSID.

The Provider shall submit an Albany County Claim Form as well as an Excel Spreadsheet which provides itemization details on each client's service delivery.

The claim forms and itemized spreadsheet totals must match and will be submitted monthly to:

Accounting Division, Albany County Department of Social Services 162 Washington Avenue, 3rd Floor, Albany, NY 12210.

The Provider acknowledges that failure to follow the procedure will result in delayed or denied payments.

Client Concerns

The Provider will work closely with Albany County Department for Aging to ensure all drivers have received annual training using the County's Driver training program. The driver training will specifically address policies and procedures that drivers must follow to remain properly oriented to detect and report changes in a client's condition or environment.

The drivers will report all apparent deterioration in the physical, mental, or environmental condition of a client and then the Provider will be required to report this information to the Albany County NY Connects Unit or assigned Case Manager by telephone on the same day the deterioration in condition is detected. If a life-threatening emergency arises, a call to 911 and the senior's emergency contacts will be made immediately. The Assessment Unit will also be immediately notified by telephone.

If the Provider determines that laundry pick-up and delivery services requested for a client cannot be provided, the Provider will submit a written report substantiating why such services cannot be provided and it shall be forwarded to the County no later than the next business day.

If an appointment prevents a client from being home at the time the laundry is being picked up or delivered, they will be instructed to call the Provider and let them know at least 24 hours in advance. The Provider should attempt to make arrangements to conduct the pickup and deliver on an alternative day if possible.

If the Provider conducts multiple unsuccessful attempts for a laundry pick-up and delivery to a client, and the client does not notify the Provider, and there are no known changes in circumstances, the Provider will notify The Department immediately so a determination can be made as to whether the client's laundry services should be terminated.

Contingency Plan

The Provider must provide a written contingency plan in the event of a disaster or emergency situation, and include their capability to pick up and deliver during inclement weather.

In the event of service disruptions for any reason (equipment or vehicle breakdowns, water or chemical issues, staffing issues, etc.), Provider must provide a written plan to demonstrate that they are capable of providing on going contractual requirements and services to The Department and its' clients.

Equitable Reverse Mortgage Assistance Program (ERMA)

In December 2019, the Center for NYC Neighborhoods, Sustainable Neighborhoods LLC (a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Center for NYC Neighborhoods), and Enterprise Community Partners are introducing a reverse mortgage foreclosure prevention program — Equitable Reverse Mortgage Assistance (ERMA) — with support from the New York State Attorney General's Office.

The goal of the program is to limit displacement of senior homeowners by providing deferred low-cost loans to reverse mortgage holders who are at risk of defaulting or are in default on their loans due to municipal property taxes, property insurance obligations, or other charges stemming from a temporary inability to pay.

Background

Home Equity Conversion Mortgages (HECMs aka reverse mortgages) allow qualifying senior homeowners aged 62 years or above to tap into their home equity. Unlike a conventional mortgage, a reverse mortgage does not require monthly mortgage payments on the principal or interest (PI). Rather, the loan is repaid upon sale of the home or death of the owner. While reverse mortgages are a valuable tool for some seniors, they can be problematic for others because though there are no PI payments to make, homeowners are still at risk of foreclosure due to missed property taxes and insurance. Delinquency on those payments results in default on the reverse mortgage. In recent years, reverse mortgage defaults and foreclosures have dramatically increased both in New York and nationwide, subjecting many senior homeowners to potential displacement. Elderly homeowners who have invested their life savings in their communities are now being foreclosed upon, often for small sums.

Program Overview

The ERMA pilot program creates a flexible response to support at-risk NYS senior homeowners who are at risk of foreclosure on their reverse mortgages. The pilot will provide deferred, zero interest loans to eligible seniors. Eligible homeowners will also have optional access to advance payments for up to two years of property-related charges, which Sustainable Neighborhoods LLC (SN), the lender for ERMA, will distribute directly to the servicer on behalf of the homeowner. These funds will be set aside by the servicer and used to pay property-related charges over time on the borrower's behalf until the advance is exhausted. Arrears and advance payments for a given homeowner will not exceed \$25,000.

The pilot will utilize partnerships with participating servicers as well as the services of the New York State Homeowner Protection Program (HOPP), a network of more than 85 trusted partners dedicated to providing homeowners with free, qualified mortgage assistance relief services across New York.

It is expected that most ERMA applicants will have missed property tax payments. SN will be working directly with mortgage servicers to cure the missed payments using ERMA funds borrowed by the homeowner. The only cost to the homeowner will be county recording fees, which will be included in the principal balance of the zero interest, deferred loan. All other administrative and lending costs will be paid from grant funds and not charged to the borrowers. All participating homeowners will receive free support and assistance from the HOPP network as well as the Center for NYC Neighborhoods.

In the pilot stage of the program, ERMA will only be available in select New York State counties. A final list of participating counties will be promulgated in fall 2019. Furthermore, due to capital constraints, the number of loans made during the pilot phase of the program will be limited. Capital allocations will be split among New York City, Long Island, and the rest of the state, reflecting the distribution of reverse mortgage defaults.

Participating counties will be expected to participate in a working group that will develop best practices in the preservation of senior homeownership in NY State, and will commit to exploring strategies to limit displacement of seniors in their jurisdictions. The working group will hold quarterly virtual meetings.



The Office of Immigration Assistance requests an amendment to extend the terms of our contract with the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services through October 31, 2020.

In 2015, Albany County was awarded \$450,000 per year, for a total of three years, by the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services to be used for the costs of creating and maintaining the Regional Immigration Assistance Center for Region #3. Our office subsequently opened in April 2016, and since its inception we have been responsible for providing legal support, assistance, training and education to indigent providers within our designated fourteen-county region that improves the overall quality of mandated representation afforded to indigent, noncitizen clients in criminal and family courts.

The Center previously requested and received approval for an amendment for the contract period November 1, 2018 to October 31, 2019. I am requesting an amendment to extend the contract period from November 1, 2019 to October 31, 2020.

It is imperative that the Center maintain its operations for a number of reasons:

(1) The Center continues to conduct trainings at Public Defender offices across Region 3 on the intersection of Immigration, Criminal and Family Law. These trainings are aimed at ensuring continued quality representation of noncitizens in criminal and family court proceedings. We continue to receive training requests to conduct these trainings.

- (2) The Center continues to advise Public Defender offices on numerous open criminal and family court cases affecting non-citizens across Region 3, and therefore, must remain open in order to continue to do this work.
- (3) The Center has partnered with, and continues to develop collaborations with, community partners involved in immigration work in the Capital Region and beyond.
- (4) Due to increased enforcement of immigration laws within Region 3, including courthouse arrests, it is important that the Center remain open to continue offering guidance to (a) court mandated attorneys as they assist their noncitizen clients in criminal and family court, as well as to (b) non-citizens in Albany County who need assistance with immigration-related applications and/or issues.

Should our request for a contract amendment be granted, we do not anticipate any impact to our 2020 budget as there are unused funds from the delay in opening all of the Regional Immigration Assistance Centers. Based on the foregoing, we respectfully request that the Albany County Legislature approve the extension of our contract so we may continue this important work of providing the legal support and assistance that was envisioned when this grant was awarded.





Section IV: Plan Implementation

Customer Overview:

County of Albany is looking to replace its current, homegrown records management system. The current system was deployed in 2003 and is no longer supported. The replacement should manage the full lifecycle of physical records, allowing County of Albany to classify, organize, and track files and boxes from creation to final disposition. The County would like to improve their internal and external processes b using barcode readers to track the physical records. County of Albany would like to implement a web-based tool that can modernize their records management processes. The chosen tool also needs to be able to integrate with the county's already purchased Laserfiche Rio Electronic Content Management System (ECMS) for the Albany County Hall of Records (ACHOR).

ACHOR has two separate functions: the Records Center, and the Archives. The Records Center holds the records of County, City, and Judicial agencies and are not publicly available. These mostly active records comprise about 85% of the volume in ACHOR. The other 15% of the volume is from the Archives, which contains numerous physical documents types, such as: documents, oversized volumes, photographs, maps, microfilm, and microfiche.

Key features required must include, at minimum:

- 1. The creation and distribution of permissions by a System Administrator to users both internally (based here at ACHOR) and externally (out and among the various agencies/departments) to utilize the new application with permission level/type dictating user access and capabilities.
- The general management of records throughout their life cycle, including their creation and destruction, and the application of the New York State Records Retention and Disposition Schedules to the records.
- The tracking of records consisting of the various types of containers referred to above via machine-readable system ("barcoding") at locations internally (within ACHOR's facility) and externally (out and among the agencies/departments).
- 4. The ability to access and update information in the new application via portable handheld devices (i.e. users should be able to access and alter information from wherever they are, rather than solely at their desks/typical work areas).
- 5. The creation of custom (and customizable) reports generated from data contained within the new system, as well as the ability to create ad-hoc reports.
- 6. The ability to charge/bill agencies/departments/other user-entities for services rendered by ACHOR, including but not limited to storage, retrieval, destruction, provision of containers, etc.
- 7. The ability to audit and record all actions that occur within the new system by the System Administrator, including but not limited to user access of the electronic records stored in Laserfiche.
- 8. In addition to the above general criteria for the replacement system (see "Section 4: Scope of Services" for more specific criteria), interested firms shall also provide the following services during the project:
- 9. Coordinate installation of new application and required technical infrastructure with Albany County DIS.
- 10. Satisfy any technical requirements established by Albany County DIS (for specifics, see "Section 4: Scope of Services," specifically Appendix A)
- 11. Migrate and convert data from ACHOR's existing application to the new application.

- 12. Coordinate integration of new application and Laserfiche Rio with Albany County DIS and any other relevant parties such that data/information from Laserfiche flows freely into the new system.
- 13. Project Management including establishment and holding of regular, periodic meetings between proposer, ACHOR staff, DIS staff, and any other relevant parties.
- 14. New application training for users and DIS staff.
- 15. User manuals and/or online tutorials, as well as web-based instructions.
- 16. Management and oversight of/for any system upgrades that may occur during the life of the contract.
- 17. Help desk access and support via both toll-free telephone and email means to assist staff at any point during development and implementation processes.

Project Scope:

Infolinx will perform the following tasks to implement a new records and information management solution: 1) Define Application Architecture, 2) Define Application Configuration & Functionality, and 3) Provide Production Solution. The Scope of Work tasks are based on the following assumptions and dependencies:

- 1) Infolinx will provide staff availability for assistance in requirements definition and testing. County of Albany will perform acceptance testing in the test environment and
- Infolinx and County of Albany will each assign an individual to act in the capacity of Project Manager for this project to coordinate the project activities.

Infolinx confirms that we are able to meet all requirements listed within RFP #2019-110, including:

- Appendix A: Scope of Services: Technical and Infrastructure Requirements

Overall Project Approach and Project Timeline:

The Department of Mental Health requests permission to enter into a contract in 2020 with Northeast Career Planning (The Workshop) for the provision of sheltered workshop services to Albany County citizens suffering from developmental disabilities. I. Purpose

NY-Alert provides an Authorized Entity the ability to send emergency and safety related messaging to targeted recipients.

Entities that partner with ITS for use of NY-Alert may develop specific policies and procedures that meet the identified needs of their Entity, so long as the procedures do not deviate from, dilute or contradict the terms and conditions contained within this Agreement.

II. Procedures for Obtaining Authorization to Access NY-Alert

Attachment 1, PROCESS FOR NY-ALERT INTEGRATION and APPROVAL, outlines the procedures that an Entity must follow in order to get authorization to access NY-Alert.

III. Definitions:

- a. Authorized Entity: An entity that has been granted approval to access and use NY-Alert by ITS.
- b. Notifier: A person who has been designated by an Authorized Entity to create Notifications within NY-Alert on behalf of that Authorized Entity.
- c. Notification: A message, press release or alert.
- d. Notification Group: A collection of Subscribers or enrollees to NY-Alert designated to receive Notifications disseminated by an Authorized Entity (e.g., parents of a student enrolled in a school district).
- e. Private Notification: A Notification provided by an Authorized Entity to a targeted audience within their organization (e.g., a Notification by a school or college campus alerting their students of a closing due to inclement weather).
- f. Private Organization: An Authorized Entity who has not been approved to provide Public Safety Alerting.
- g. Public Safety Alert: An alert issued by a Public Safety Organization before, during and after an emergency, critical incident or event (whether natural or technological) (e.g., Notifications for evacuations, sheltering in place, Haz-Mat release, etc.).
- h. Public Safety Organization: A State and/or local government organization responsible for public safety (e.g., Emergency Management Offices, Police Departments, Fire

This MOU will allow information sharing to evaluate the effects of Bail Reform compared to previous years. Bail Reform in New York State is effective 1.1.2020. It is estimated up to 90% of all persons arrested would be eligible for release. Release under non-monetary conditions should be the least restrictive conditions to insure return to court. These conditions include contact reminders, conditions of release and electronic monitoring. This MOU will be the opportunity for evaluation and the impact to Albany County. Effective 1.1.2020 Albany County Probation has been designated the Pretrial Service Agency in Albany County to provide Bail Reform service.



Beyond the Big Apple: The Impact of Bail Reform in Upstate, Central, and Western New York

Project Narrative

New York's new bail laws include provisions that mandate pretrial release, limit conditions of pretrial supervision, and impose more affordable forms of bail. As potentially one of the most far-reaching pieces of bail reform legislation passed in recent history, the opportunity for evaluation and measuring impact is profound. There is an urgent need to carefully monitor the implementation of the reforms so that successes can be noted, challenges can be addressed, and the unintended consequences can be readily spotted.

It is particularly important to develop a nuanced understanding of bail reform in counties outside of New York City—home to over 8 million New Yorkers and over 1,300 courts that process half of all arrests statewide. These parts of New York receive much less attention than downstate, which is why Vera will study the statewide impact of the new bail reforms with a focus on upstate, central, and western New York. We will (1) evaluate the law's impact on jail populations statewide; and (2) conduct site-based research in 6 counties outside of New York City to examine the impact on pretrial release and bail practices. Through this research, we will provide state and local policy makers, practitioners, and the public with a clear understanding of the impact of these reforms. We will also draw lessons for a national audience, particularly other states considering pretrial reform and closely watching to learn from New York's experience.

Part 1. Statewide Analysis of Jail Population

We will examine how front-end reforms, at arrest and arraignment, impact back-end outcomes, including the use of jails for pretrial detention and sentenced populations. Certain provisions of the new laws, including the use of appearance tickets, mandatory pretrial release on many misdemeanor and non-violent felony charges, and the consideration of ability to pay in cases that still qualify for bail, will likely have an impact on the number of people in jail—both in terms of admissions and length of stay. We would like to examine the impact of the new reforms on the statewide jail population using deidentified individual-level records obtained through data sharing agreements with county sheriffs' offices, monthly jail census reports provided by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (NYS DCJS), and New York State and New York City Open Data. Using these combined data sources, we will:

- 1. Examine the change in jail admissions and daily jail population by custody status, charge, admission and discharge type after the implementation of the laws.
- 2. Examine the change in the length of stay after the implementation of the laws and how these changes differ by charge, admission, and discharge type.
- 3. Explore whether the impact of the legislative changes have disparate impacts across demographic groups, with a particular focus on race and ethnicity.
- 4. Compare and explore the characteristics of people detained pretrial before January 2020 and those detained pretrial after January 2020.
- 5. Explore the average amount of bail set and the length of time it takes for people to make bail.
- 6. Examine if these changes differ by county as well as between New York City and the rest of the state.

Part 2. Site-based Analysis of Pretrial Release and Bail Decisions in Six Counties

We will conduct an in-depth study in six counties to examine the impact of the new law on pretrial release, bail decisions, and subsequent court appearance and pretrial detention. Site selection will be finalized in the first three months of the project, but we hope to partner with a range of counties. Our target partners are Albany, Broome, Cortland, Erie, Greene, and Oneida counties based on regional diversity, size, and a variety of local criminal justice practices, including counsel at first appearance and centralized arraignment parts. We will collect data from local courts including city, town, and village courts to examine changes in decision-making at different

discretion points in the pretrial process. We will supplement court data with data from additional local sources including law enforcement, pretrial services providers, public defenders, assigned counsel, and prosecutors in the six counties.

For this site-specific part of the research, our project goals include:

- Aim 1: Examine the impact of the new laws on pretrial release. The new law eliminates the use of money bail and mandates release for the majority of charges. Beyond this, the new law requires judges to consider the least restrictive means to ensure a person's appearance in court. We will compare counts and rates of release on recognizance and release under supervision between the pre-implementation period and post-implementation period in each county. We will examine any disparities in the types of conditions imposed on different demographic groups, including the use of electronic monitoring. We will also examine the effect of those pretrial decisions on court appearance and pretrial re-arrest rates.
- Aim 2: Examine the impact of the new laws on bail setting and bail making. Money bail is still an option in the vast majority of violent felonies, some non-violent felonies, and limited misdemeanor charges under the new law. However, the legislation attempts to ensure that the use of bail is less onerous by requiring judges to consider a person's ability to pay and to utilize partially secured or unsecured bond options. We will examine changes in the forms and amounts of bail set, bail making, and length of pretrial detention before bail is posted between the pre-implementation period and post-implementation period. We will also examine how courtroom actors including judges, public defenders, and prosecutors interpret the new ability to pay provisions and change their practices accordingly.
- Aim 3: Examine the impact of the new laws on failure to appear and re-arrest. Under the new law, judges may only issue a bench warrant for failure to appear after a 48-hour grace period and may only revoke pretrial release after a hearing if the person is found to willfully and persistently fail to appear for the purposes of avoiding prosecution. To examine the impact of these two provisions, we will compare the rates of pretrial noncompliance and the rates of pretrial detention between the pre- and post-implementation period. We will also examine what conditions courts set after revoking release and how courtroom actors define "willful and persistent" failure to appear.
- Aim 4: Examine the perceived impact of the new laws by system actors and people impacted by the system. We will also apply qualitative research methods (e.g., interviews and court observations) to understand nuances in the implementation of the new laws and its impact. These methods will elucidate the process of implementing the new laws, provide insights on the perceived benefits and limitations of the reform, and identify any obstacles to successful implementation from the perspective of local stakeholders, including people who are directly impacted by justice system involvement. Through court observations, we will explore how system actors such as judges, prosecutors, and defense attorneys exercise their discretion in the use of risk assessment instrument and other tools to impose pretrial conditions and assess ability to pay. By analyzing transcribed interviews, we will identify common themes surfaced from multiple participants and explore differences across jurisdictions and system actors.
- Aim 5: Examine the indirect effects of the law on arrests, sentencing and dispositions. We will also examine whether there are any unexpected and indirect impacts of the new laws on arrests, sentencing, and dispositions. We will explore the changes in the patterns of arrest to better understand how law enforcement may be changing their practices in response to this law. In addition, we will explore how cases are disposed and sentenced compared to similar cases before implementation. Although the law does not affect these practices directly, we want to monitor changes in these outcomes to see if the law has any indirect effect on "upstream" and "downstream" junctures in the life of a case.



Selected research questions involving practices of pretrial service providers

Aim 1: Examine the impact of the new laws on pretrial release.

- 1-1. Are there new levels of release under supervision that were created as a result of the new law?
- 1-2. For people released under supervision, what is the change in the level of pretrial supervision imposed and the conditions of release?
- 1-3. What is the impact of different conditions of release on failure-to-appear (FTA) rates and pretrial re-arrest rates?

Aim 3: Examine the impact of the new laws on failure to appear and re-arrest.

3-1. Does variation in the method of court notification used impact the FTA rate and number of bench warrants issued?

Aim 4: Examine the perceived impact of the new laws by system actors.

- 4-1. How are conditions of pretrial release determined? Is there any change in the process in which conditions of release are determined after implementation of the new laws?
- 4-2. What are the perceived effects of different types of court notification methods?
- 4-3. Are there specific resources, information, or capacity constraints that are limiting effective implementation?







Dear Chairperson Joyce:

The Albany County Public Defender's Office requests the extension of Resolution No. 28, of 2019 adopted on 2/11/19 (copy attached), which resolved to allow the consideration and hiring of qualified applicants to fill vacant positions of Assistant Albany County Public Defenders who reside out of County, "on the condition that said employee(s) moves into Albany County within one year of their start date. Said resolution is set to expire on 2/01/20.

We are requesting that the Alternate Public Defender's Office be included in this request and that the Resolution for both offices be further extended for the term of the Statewide Implementation Contract, which runs through March 31, 2023. While it will continue to be our preference to hire qualified candidates who live in Albany County, we believe a longer waiver will be necessary to remain competitive. With each additional year of Statewide Implementation the number of attorney vacancies will increase in Albany County and throughout New York State. To keep our office competitive we need to be on a level playing field with Counties throughout the state.

Since the introduction of the Resolution a year ago, the Public Defender's Office has engaged in ongoing recruitment for attorneys in and beyond the geographic boundaries of Albany County. We have recruited by word of mouth, and more formally, through Albany Law School and the Albany County Bar Association. We have also participated in Career and Job Fairs in Buffalo, Syracuse and in Albany. Additionally, we have also recruited through a network of New York State law schools, online and through Albany County's Office of Affirmative Action. In that one year period, many applicants were interviewed and five new attorneys were hired, four of them from out of County. All four have long since relocated to and are now domiciled in Albany County.

As we indicated one year ago when the proposal was initially presented, the funding stream from the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services, which is intended to expand and modernize all public agencies and offices across New York State providing indigent legal representation and services to people charged with criminal activity is now in "full gear". Albany County is set to receive well over 26 million dollars in funding through March 31, 2024 and more beyond. There is and will be, continuous competition for qualified attorneys willing to serve the public in this manner. Other counties across this State have adopted similar residency policies or dropped the requirement altogether.

We are scheduled to hire several new attorneys in 2020, filling newly created positions and any vacancies that might occur. More attorneys are expected to be recruited and hired in 2021 through 2024, to meet the goals and objectives established by the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services. Albany County, the Capital of New York State, needs to remain as competitive as possible.

Legislative approval is required in order to allow Albany County to enter into a Grant Contract with the State of New York, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services, as a recipient of a FY2018 Hazmat Grant and to amend the budget as shown below. Approval to enter into the application was previously submitted and approved by the Legislature in Resolution number 193 of May 13, 2019.

As stated in our previous request, the grant award for the Capital Region Hazardous Materials Committee is \$150,000.00 and covers the grant period 9/1/2019-8/31/2021. We usually receive this grant every year but there is no guarantee the program will continue in the future. Albany County is the fiduciary for the committee and has been for several years. These grant funds will be utilized to cover training, equipment acquisition and equipment calibration and maintenance for the Hazmat Teams in Albany, Rensselaer, Saratoga and Schenectady Counties. The committee meets monthly to administer the four-county hazmat program.
